Accreditations update

We accredited 855 new non-domestic renewable energy installations for the RHI between January and March 2014. This is an increase of 77% on accreditations in the same quarter of 2013.

In March there were 451 new applications, more than a quarter more than we received either in February or in January.

The government has proposed changes to the Non-Domestic RHI regulations that are currently being considered by Parliament.

These changes would affect new applications and, for example, result in new tariffs and eligible technologies.

The government plans to introduce legislation to ensure fuels for biomass installations meet sustainability criteria. Subject to parliamentary approval, this would affect existing and new participants of the scheme.
