Energy Code Reform: Membership of the Modification Process Workgroup

We would like to thank stakeholders who responded to our request for volunteers to join Ofgem's Modification Process Workgroup (MPW).¹ To provide visibility to stakeholders, this letter confirms the membership of the MPW.

Context

Alongside our January 2024 consultation on the implementation of energy code reform, we published a request for volunteers to join an Ofgem led workgroup. The purpose of this workgroup (the MPW) is to support Ofgem in the development of an updated code modification process which we expect to consult on as part of our work to implement energy code reform.

We received a high number of responses from industry stakeholders, and we are grateful to respondents who offered their time to participate in the MPW. In our request for volunteers, we explained that if we received more volunteers than could be accommodated as members of the workgroup, we would aim to select members who:

- have cross code expertise
- can provide multiple constituency or industry perspectives
- are, or were previously, a member of a code panel
- can commit to attending all meetings
- have the broadest relevant skills and knowledge.
