Re: Statutory Consultation on consequential amendments to Standard Licence Condition 1.3 and 20.5A in the Electricity Supply Licence, and 1.2 and 20.6A in the Gas Supply Licence.

SSE Energy Solutions welcomes the opportunity to respond to Ofgem's Statutory Consultation on consequential amendments to Standard Licence Condition 1.3 and 20.5A in the Electricity Supply Licence, and 1.2 and 20.6A in the Gas Supply Licence in relation to the Non-Domestic market review Decision¹. Our answers to the consultation questions are as follows:

1. Do you agree that the amendments set out in this consultation will enable us to achieve the policy intent of the requirements set out in our Non-Domestic Market Review Decision?

We agree with Ofgem that these are small changes to the supply licences to ensure the relevant policy is implemented as intended. As per our previous response to Ofgem's Non-domestic market review: Findings and statutory consultation (submitted 31 January 2024), we are supportive of the intent of the changes to improve outcomes for non-domestic energy consumers.

2. Do you have any comments on the proposed supply licence text amendments set out in Appendix 1?

We agree that the proposed amendments to update two defined terms within the supply licence conditions, namely the definitions for 'Third Party' and 'Third Party Costs' held within Condition 1 (SLC 1.3 in the electricity supply licence and SLC 1.2 in the g as supply licence) are sensible and correct. Similarly, we agree with the proposed consequential changes to SLC 20.5A in the electricity supply licence and SLC 20.6A in the gas supply licence, to clarify the obligation on suppliers to only work with TPIs that are signed up to a redress scheme when those TPIs work with Micro Business Consumers (and Small Business customers, when this comes into effect as per Ofgem's Decision) are sensible and correct.

We look forward to continuing to work collaboratively with Ofgem.
