Dear Sir/Madam,

Northern Ireland Fuel Mix Disclosure 2025 - Renewable Energy Guarantees of Origin (REGOs)

We are contacting you, as a generator accredited under the Renewable Energy Guarantees of Origin (REGO) scheme, to make you aware of the Northern Ireland (NI) Fuel Mix Disclosure (FMD) deadline for licensed electricity suppliers of **31 March** every year. It is likely that your current electricity supplier is endeavouring to comply with the NI FMD deadline and may require you to transfer your REGOs to them to ensure that it is met.

We also want to make you aware of important information regarding the launch of the Renewable Electricity Register (RER). The RER will replace the Renewables & Combined Heat and Power Register (R&CHP) during the NI FMD period. **This will result in your obligations transferring from the, R&CHP, to the new RER platform.**

If you are not required or do not intend to sell your REGOs to your supplier, then please ignore the information listed below and no further action is required.

What is Fuel Mix Disclosure?

Fuel Mix Disclosure is required by Article 3(6) of Directive 2003/54/EC, replaced by Article 3(9) of Directive 2009/72/EC. The transposing legislation in Ireland requires the Commission for Energy Regulation ("CER") to ensure suppliers provide reliable fuel mix information used to generate the electricity supplied annually, on all bills and promotional materials issued to customers. In Northern Ireland the transposing legislation requires that licenses issued by the Utility Regulator ("the UR") include a condition requiring compliance with Article 3(6). REGOs are the main evidence source used by licensed electricity suppliers to prove the proportion of renewable electricity supplied to their customers. As such, if you sell the renewable electricity you generated for the generation period of **1 January 2024 to 31 December 2024** to your supplier, they may also require you to transfer your REGOs for this generation period to them well in advance of their deadline of midday **31 March 2025**.

What is the disclosure period for 2025?

This disclosure period is **1 January 2024 to 31 December 2024**.

What do we expect generators to do?

- If you are still to **claim and transfer** REGOs for generation between **1 January 2024** and **31 December 2024** please do so as soon as possible. All claims and transfers of REGOs should be made via your account on the R&CHP Register, or the RER platform post launch (see below).

For the R&CHP please follow the instructions in section 5 of the [Register User Guide](#) on how to submit output data and section 6 on how to transfer certificates. You will need to obtain the Renewables and CHP Register unique ID number of your supplier's account to complete the transfer transaction.

RER platform launch

The Renewable Electricity Register (RER) is due to be launched during the Northern Ireland Fuel Mix Disclosure period. This will result in your obligations transferring from the previous register, R&CHP, to the new RER platform.

Please keep an eye out for future communications that will include a link to the new RER platform as well as helpful guidance material, including a comprehensive user guide.

In early February all generators were invited to a demonstration webinar on the new RER. This session will take place on 13 February 2025. We strongly encourage generators to attend the demonstration.

Please note: Requests made near to the supplier's deadline of **31 March 2025** cannot be guaranteed to be issued and transferred to the supplier's account on the R&CHP Register or the RER before the deadline. This may mean that you will not get paid for your REGO by the supplier you have an agreement with.
