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### Statutory consultation on modifications to NGET's licence in relation to consequential costs from ESO separation

Dear David,

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to Ofgem's statutory consultation on the proposed licence modifications.

In summary, we support the changes to the special conditions of the Electricity Transmission licence held by National Grid Electricity Transmission (NGET) and the the ET2 price control financial instruments.

It is worth noting that the proposed numbering (Special Condition 9.21: Termination of the OSA) duplicates Ofgem's recent statutory consultation dated 10 December 2024 on the proposed introduction of Special Condition 9.21 (Conflict Mitigation Arrangements for Onshore Electricity Transmission Tender Exercise) in to the NGET and other transmission licences. We propose that the Termination of the OSA condition is re-numbered as Special Condition 9.22 when directed in to the NGET licence.

While not a financial instrument, the regulatory reporting pack (RRP) and the regulatory instructions and guidance (RIGs) will also need updating. We would value Ofgem setting out its proposed changes in the same way that it has for the price control financial handbook (PCFH) and the price control financial model (PCFM). This will ensure that allowances for consequential costs are not lost in the RIIO-ET3 determinations and model updates.

We look forward to engaging with you further throughout National Energy System Operator's (NESO's) exit of transitional services.
