This document is part of the regulatory instructions and guidance (RIGs) for RIIO-ED2.

The term RIGs refers to a collection of documents – our instructions and guidance and the reporting packs and commentaries the DNOs have to fill out. The RIGs are the main way we get information from the DNOs. We need this information to administer, and check compliance with, the electricity distribution licence and RIIO-ED2 final determinations.

This document outlines reporting timescales and common guidance for the DNOs to follow when submitting reporting packs and commentaries to us.

The RIGs will be used to collect actual and forecast data from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2028.

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## 1. Summary – Information Required

One Commentary document is required per DNO Group. Respondents should ensure that comments are clearly marked to show whether they relate to all the DNOs in the group or to which DNO they relate.

Commentary is required in response to specific questions included in this document. DNO's may include supporting documentation where they consider it necessary to support their comments or where it may aid Ofgem's understanding. Please highlight in this document if additional information is provided.

The purpose of this commentary is to provide the opportunity for DNOs to set out further supporting information on their reported movements in asset health, criticality and monetised risk reported in the NARM Reporting Pack.

## 2. Table by table commentary

### Commentary on Health and Criticality Movements

**Commentary relating to the relevant reporting year. This should include details on the following where applicable:**

- the nature and impact of any Material Changes
- instances where movements in this worksheet do not reconcile with equivalent movements in the Asset Register (in the Costs and Volumes Reporting Pack)
- the impact of interventions upon the forecast 2028 indices
- any other relevant information affecting the movements reported in asset health, criticality or monetised risk."
