

Gas Distribution Network Sales NTS-DN Business Separation : Conclusions



Key issues

- If it occurs, the sale of one or more DNs would give rise to new commercial incentives
- Transco NTS could potentially confer an undue commercial advantage on RDNs relative to IDNs, for instance:
 - When contracting for and calling interruption; and
 - When scheduling maintenance.
- An unequal playing field could limit the benefits of comparative competition
- Business separation is one of a number of measures that seek to reduce the risk of undue discrimination

Costs and benefits of separation

Costs of separation

Potential to impose significant costs on Transco

- extent these costs will be passed through is limited

Risk that rules will become detailed & complex

- costly to administer
- difficult to monitor compliance
- difficult to demonstrate breach

Benefits of separation

Reduces risk of undue discrimination

- limits chance for info sharing
- removes individuals from situations where disc. may occur
- limits opportunities for NTS-DN staff to develop close relationships

Establishes a transparent interface between businesses

- separate boards created
- contracts formalised



Responses to Offtake RIA

- 9 out of 12 respondents favoured full legal & structural separation
- 1 supported Option 1, and another supported Option 2



Transco's views

- Prefers an amended version of Option 1 (incorporating further structural separation)
- Believe opportunities for undue discrimination are limited
- Option 3 is not 'fit for purpose' as it will not protect against undue discrimination
- Targeted structural separation may deliver an appropriate degree of separation to mitigate risk of undue discrimination, without full cost



NTS-DN Business separation: Conclusions

- Minded to adopt legal separation plus targeted structural separation
- Proportionate mechanism for establishing a level playing field
- Aligns with requirements that apply to other energy businesses
- 'Minded-to' because the implementation issues associated with legal separation are still being resolved
