European Commission decision on Ofgem's decision to grant South Hook LNG Terminal Company Ltd (SHTCL) and Grain LNG Ltd (GLNG) an exemption under section 19C(5) of the Gas Act 1986 (the "Gas Act") from the application of section 19D of the Gas Act

On 29 November 2004, Ofgem published final views on SHTCL's application under section 19C of the Gas Act for an exemption from section 19D of the Gas Act. On 3 December 2004, Ofgem published final views on GLNG's application under section 19C of the Gas Act for an exemption from section 19D of the Gas Act. In both cases Ofgem considered that all the exemption criteria are met and therefore the Authority decided to grant SHTCL and GLNG an exemption under section 19C(5) of the Gas Act from the application of section 19D of the Gas Act.

Ofgem's final views, together with the exemption orders and all supporting documents were subsequently submitted to the European Commission. The European Commission has two months in which it can veto a decision by the relevant authority in a Member State to grant an exemption, or request that the regulatory authority amend its decision.³

On 10 February 2005, Ofgem received a decision from the European Commission. The European Commission has decided not to request Ofgem to amend or withdraw its decision. Therefore, the exemptions granted to SHTCL and GLNG remain in place.
