

Notice of reasons for decisions under Section 49A of the Electricity Act 1989

Approval of Southern Electric Power Distribution Plc (SEPD) use of system and connection charging methodologies under Standard licence conditions 4(1) and 4B(1)

1. Standard licence condition (SLC) 4(1) of the electricity distribution licence (as amended on 7 July 2004) requires distribution network operators (DNOs) to determine a use of system (UoS) charging methodology approved by the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (the Authority) by 1 April 2005.
2. SLC4B(1) of the electricity distribution licence (as amended on 7 July 2004) requires DNOs to determine a connection charging methodology approved by the Authority by 1 April 2005.
3. On 11 February 2005, in accordance with SLC4(1) and 4B(1), the Authority:
 - a. Approved SEPD's UoS charging methodology, subject to one condition; and
 - b. Approved SEPD's connection charging methodology.
4. On 16 December 2004, in accordance with SLC4A(1), the Authority approved the form of the SEPD statement of use of system charges.
5. Where conditional approval has been granted on the charging methodologies the Authority will consider enforcement action where the condition of that approval is not met.
6.
