Classification of change	Reference in Section	Nature of changes made
Class 1	No specific paragraph listed as changes made throughout relevant Sections	General drafting improvements and corrections (eg cross references, typographical errors, formatting improvements, grammar and punctuation, use of dates, consistent use of defined terms, removal of text where redundant text (following earlier modification) etc) including drafting changes of this nature raised in response to consultation
Class 2	Specific paragraph listed in relevant Section	Change raised in response to consultation (not included as a Class 1 Change)
Class 3	Specific paragraph listed in relevant Section	Change arising from further development/refinement of business rules and drafting
Class 4	Specific paragraph listed in relevant Section	Further change arising from inclusion on Offtake Arrangements Document in the Uniform Network Code
Class 5	Specific paragraph references listed in relevant Section	Rule in Uniform Network Code repositioned within the same or a different Section or Part of the Uniform Network Code

Note 1 The guides are to assist in reviewing the changes to the relevant Sections and Parts of the Uniform Network Code made to the draft documents published on 4 March 2005.

Note 2 In respect of the Transportation Principal Document, the Modification Rules and the General Terms the guides should be read in conjunction with the drafting guides published on 4 March 2005 which identified changes made to those Parts of the Uniform Network Code by reference to the equivalent provisions of Transco's existing network code.

- Note 3 The guides are not intended to be exhaustive in identifying each and every change and the guides should not be relied upon in substitution for reviewing the Uniform Network Code.
- Note 4 Where different changes of different classes have been made to the same paragraph in a Section the relevant paragraph is identified against each relevant class.
