DSWG sub-group

- Increasing focus on the value of the demand side
 - NG June Winter Outlook report
- Group formed by Ofgem in late July
 - Three meetings of sub-group since last DSWG
- Group to identify 'quick wins' ahead of winter

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Purpose of the sub-group

• Group agreed to consider:

Information already available to the market Quality and transparency of available information How could this be improved for winter?

Actions taken by NG in its role as residual balancer

Are there any barriers to demand side response via the OCM?

Key objective: find 'quick wins' in these areas for winter

DSWG Sub-group Update – Sept 05

Available Information

- Important for market to be able to respond
 - Particular issue surrounding periods of system stress
- What information is already made available to market?
 - NG website
 - Information available to Shippers ANS
 - Comparison of information in gas and electricity

Quality/usability of available information

- Reliability of NG IT systems
 - Concerns re website updates/outages at busy periods

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Gas NISMs

- Keen for a gas equivalent to an electricity NISM
- Customers wish to provide response to NG in very specific sets of circumstances
 - Not for commercial purposes can contract for this already
 - Interruption purely for supply and demand balancing purposes when system is very tight – Stage '0'
- Need information to know when this response is required
 - Some customers need more notice than within day

Information summary page

- Essential information
- Available in other forms at present
- Inclusion of new system warnings 'Gas NISMS'

Can be done for this winter

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Information Reliability

- IE3 Resilience project
 - Existing system not meeting current user requirements
 - Seeking to address current issues with web site reliability
 - Three phases completion by June 06
- This Winter
 - 24-7 web system support
 - Specific support to five top downloaded reports
 - Group to define requirements for NG
 - Essential information requirements

Storage Information

- NG publishes storage monitor information
 - Published to the market weekly & more often during 'critical periods'
- Group considered more regular reporting of this information this would be useful for customers
 - Enable better understanding of supply and demand on the gas system
 - Particularly important during periods of system stress
- Ofgem has led discussions with storage operators
 - All storage operators have agreed to daily reporting of this information
 - Storage stock information updated for D at D+1
 - Will be made available to the market for this winter

Residual balancing actions

- Group agreed that there is a role for NG as residual balancer
 - Very specific set of circumstances
 - Shippers to balance supply and demand for vast majority of time
- Group requesting clarification of NG's interpretation of its role
 - NG to provide further clarification to DSWG today
 - Treatment of balancing actions taken for more than one day?

OCM

- Discussions re potential barriers on the OCM to the demand side
 - Lot size aggregation?
 - Timing of bids/offers when lodged and duration
 - Cost of registering + credit requirements
- APX delivered helpful presentation re operation of OCM
 - Can accept partial bids
 - Physical/locational trades can be accepted cannot be used for commercial balancing purposes
 - Changes to duration/timing of bids/offers feasible code/systems changes likely
- APX presentation to be published on Ofgem's website

'Gas NISM' contracts

- Customers want to provide response in very specific sets of circumstances
 - Not for commercial purposes
- Gas NISM could be used as a transparent 'trigger' in such contracts
 - Can be used to check that system is tight
 - May need more notice than within day
- OCM also an option for offering response
- Contract price to reflect customers opportunity costs

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Quick Wins?

- NG proposal for information summary page + Gas NISMs
 - To be in for this winter
- Improved reliability of information provision
 - 24-7 web system support
 - Additional checks for essential reports
- Release of additional storage information
 - Ofgem facilitated agreement across all storage operators
- Greater clarification of NG's residual balancing role
 - Extent of this role agreed as a group
- Further clarification re operation of OCM
 - APX explanation of different services available to market
