**Publication of the changes in the relevant Gas Transporters' single supply point charge<sup>1</sup> and in the Retail Price Index pursuant to Special Condition 1 of the Independent Gas Transporters' licences**

1. Special Condition 1<sup>2</sup> of the Independent Gas Transporters' (IGTs) licences sets out the arrangements for determining the maximum charge that licensees may levy on each premises that is subject to the Relative Price Control (RPC) regime.
2. As part of these arrangements, the percentage change in the retail price index (RPI) and the percentage change in the weighted average of the relevant gas transporters' single supply point charge (wSSP) are used to calculate the annual change in the floor and ceiling<sup>3</sup> and the annual change in transportation charges. Both the RPI and wSSP are determined and published by the Authority of Gas and Electricity Markets (Authority) in October of each year to take effect from 1 January of the following year.
3. Pursuant to Special Condition 1 of IGTs' licences, this letter sets out:
  - a. the wSSP for year 2005; and
  - b. the RPI for year 2005;

these figures should be used to adjust transportation charges from 1 January 2006 in accordance to Special Condition 1 of IGTs' licences.

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<sup>1</sup> The relevant Gas Transporters include the eight Distribution Networks. The single supply point charge comprises transmission and distribution charges.

<sup>2</sup> Special Condition 1 *Charging of Gas Shippers – Relative Price Control* was introduced in IGTs' licences in January 2004.

<sup>3</sup> The floor and ceiling are defined in Special Condition 1 and explained in Ofgem's July 2003 document *The Regulation of Independent Gas Transporter Charging – Final Proposals*.

**The change in the weighted average of the relevant Gas Transporters' single supply point charge**

4. The wSSP for year 2005 is the percentage change between the averages of the relevant Gas Transporters' single supply point charge of years 2004 and 2005 for each network region, where a year is defined from 1 October to 30 September inclusive. Table 1 provides the wSSP for each of the eight network regions. The underlying calculations are described in appendix 1.


**Table 1. wSSP per region**

<b>Region</b>	<b>wSSP (%)</b>
East of England	-1.74
North of England	-1.86
London	-1.07
North West	-1.54
Scotland	-2.31
South of England	-1.09
Wales and the West	-0.91
West Midlands	-2.10

**The change in the Retail Price Index**

5. The RPI is defined as the percentage change between the average of the retail price index for the period 1 April to 30 September 2005 and the average of the retail price index for the period 1 April to 30 September 2004.
6. The Authority has determined that the RPI for 2005 is **2.89%**. This figure should be applied from 1 January 2006 in accordance with Special Condition 1. The underlying calculations are described in appendix 1.

## Appendix 1

1. This appendix illustrates the calculations underlying the values of wSSP and RPI to be applied from 1 January 2006 in accordance with Special Condition 1 of the IGTs' licences.

### The change in the weighted average of the relevant Gas Transporters' single supply point charge

2. The wSSP for year 2005 is determined as the percentage change between the average single supply point (SSP) charge (based on unit rates) for the period from 1 October 2003 to 30 September 2004 and the average SSP charge for the period from 1 October 2004 to 30 September 2005.
3. The SSP unit rate charge is calculated for each of the 8 network regions. The SSP unit rates as shown in table 2 are derived from averaging charges across exit zones within each of the network regions<sup>4</sup>.
4. The calculations were performed for the two relevant periods, 1 October 2003 to 30 September 2004 and 1 October 2004 to 30 September 2005. The percentage change between these two periods within each network region gives the wSSP in table 1.

### The change in the Retail Price Index

5. The RPI for year 2005 is determined as the percentage change between the arithmetic average of the retail price index for the period from 1 April 2005 to 30 September 2005 and the arithmetic average of the retail price index for the period from 1 April 2004 to 30 September 2004. The calculation is shown in table 3.

<sup>4</sup> As an example, the London network comprises the average of the SSP unit rates across its three exit zones NT1, NT2 and NT3.

6. The retail price index for the relevant periods uses the data published by the Office for National Statistics.
