Use of system charging methodology: conditional approval – EHV transition¹

On 11 February 2005 the Authority issued its decision to approve Yorkshire Electricity Distribution Plc's (YEDL) use of system (UoS) charging methodology in accordance with Standard licence condition (SLC) 4(9), subject to various conditions. Amongst these was the following condition requiring YEDL to set out its:

- strategy for the transition of EHV charges effective from 1 April 2005 in its methodology by 1 April 2005 and the transitional approach (if any) for EHV charges effective from 1 April 2006 by October 2005.

In its subsequent letter on 30 March 2005, the Authority set out that the first part of this condition had been met and reiterated that the latter part of the condition relating to 1 April 2006 stood, pending further action by YEDL and further consideration of this issue by Ofgem and the industry.

Ofgem open letter

Ofgem published an open letter on the EHV transition applicable from 1 April 2006 on 19 October 2005². This document set out that Ofgem considered that EHV charges should be increased in line with the retail price index (RPI).

Following publication of Ofgem's open letter YEDL submitted a proposal on 22 November 2005. This proposal sets out that any charge increase for EHV demand customers who are not currently charged based on the charging model yardstick values will be increased by the movement in RPI.
