## Background to the amendment proposal

A number of errors and code defined term inaccuracies were identified in the CUSC. It was recognised that these defects should be corrected. In order to rectify this situation, The Company submitted the Amendment Proposals for consideration by the CUSC Panel<sup>4</sup> at its meeting on 29 September 2006. The Panel determined that the alterations in question could be appropriately defined as Housekeeping Amendments.

## The amendment proposal

The amendments proposed to correct a number of errors within the CUSC.

It was the view of the proposer that the Amendment Proposals would better facilitate the achievement of Applicable CUSC Objective (a) by correcting minor errors within the CUSC and therefore making it clearer and fit for purpose.

### Recommendation

It was recommended that CAP132-139 should be approved, and that if approved the implementation date should be 10 Business Days after the Authority decision.

## The Authority's decision

The Authority has considered the issues raised by the amendment proposal and the final Amendment Report dated 25 October 2006. The Authority has considered and taken into account the responses to The Company's consultation on the amendment proposal which are attached to the Amendment Report.<sup>5</sup> The Authority has concluded that:

1. implementation of the amendment proposal will better facilitate the achievement of the Applicable CUSC Objectives;<sup>6</sup> and

**2.** directing that the amendment be made is consistent with the Authority's principal objective and statutory duties.<sup>7</sup>

# Reasons for the Authority's decision

Having considered the Amendment Report, Ofgem considers, having regard to the Applicable CUSC Objectives and its statutory duties, that the Amendment Proposals would better facilitate the achievement of Applicable CUSC Objective (a) by correcting minor errors within the CUSC.

Ofgem considers it would have been more efficient for the changes raised within CAP132-139 to have been addressed within one amendment proposal and one Amendment Report.

## **Decision notice**

In accordance with Standard Condition C10 of NGET's Transmission Licence, the Authority, hereby directs that amendment proposal CAP132-139: "Various Housekeeping Amendments" be made and that the Implementation Date should be 23 November 2006.
