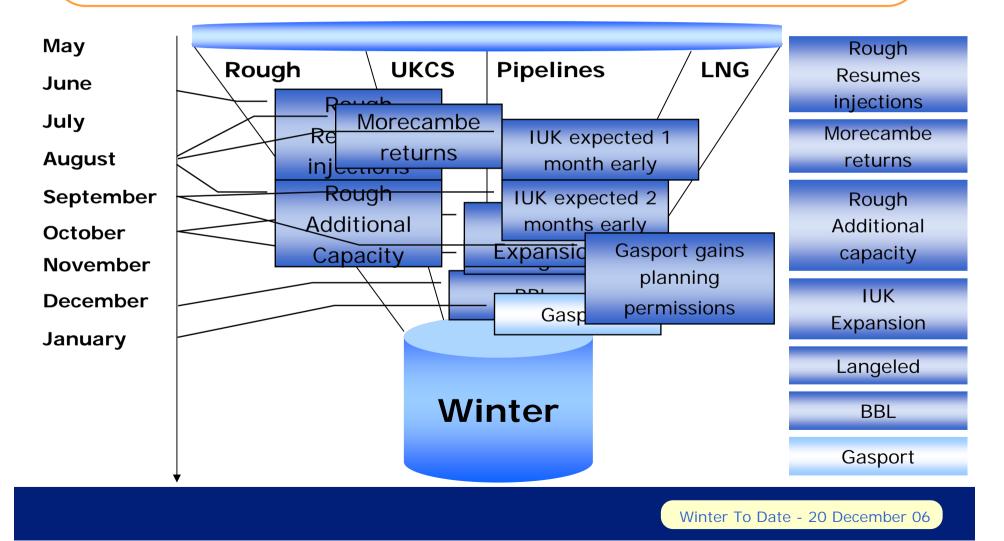

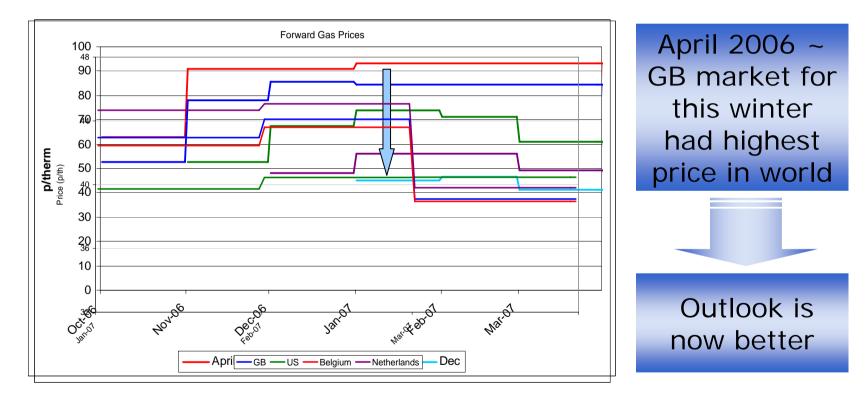

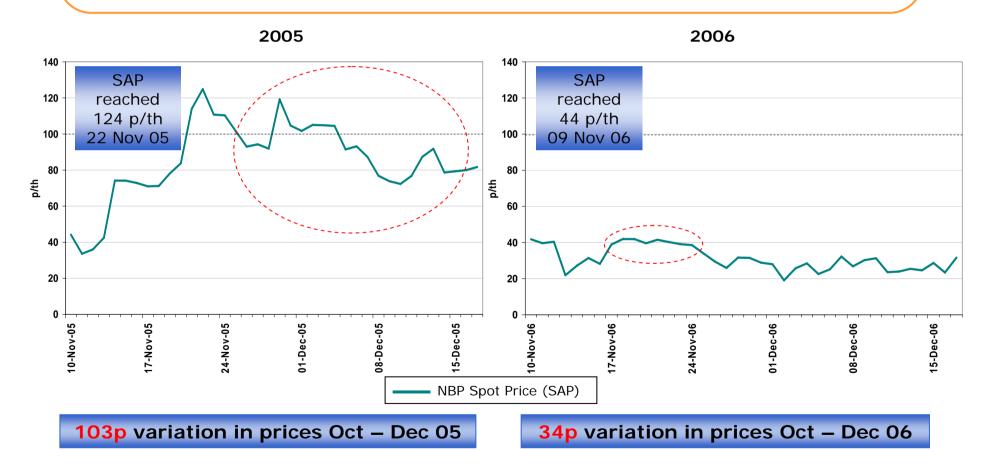


## As uncertainties reduced, so have wholesale prices...

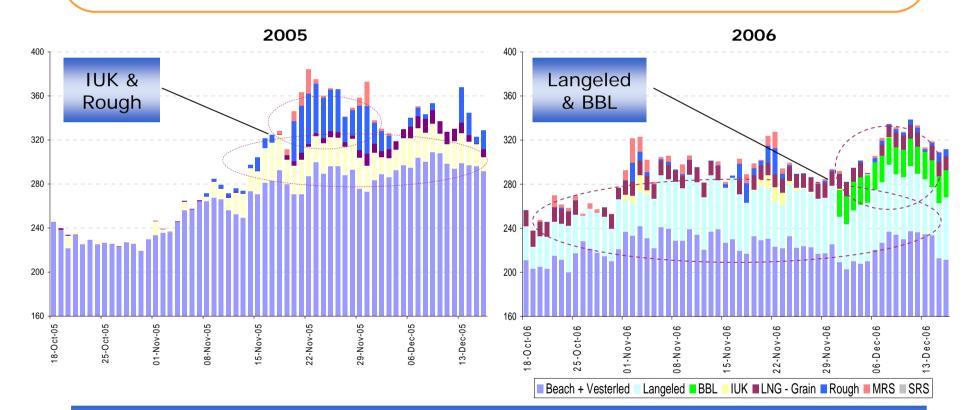


Prices for January have halved since April

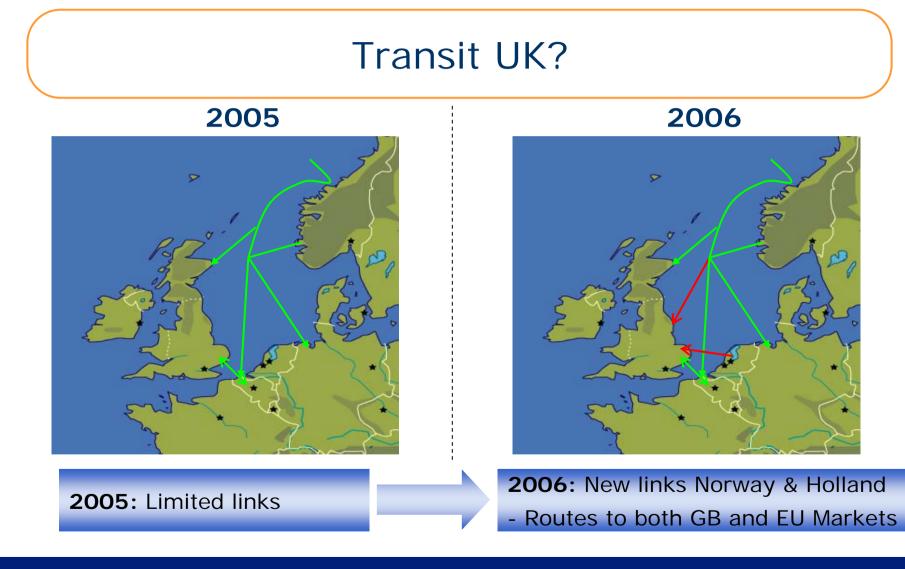
#### Not only lower, but more stable...



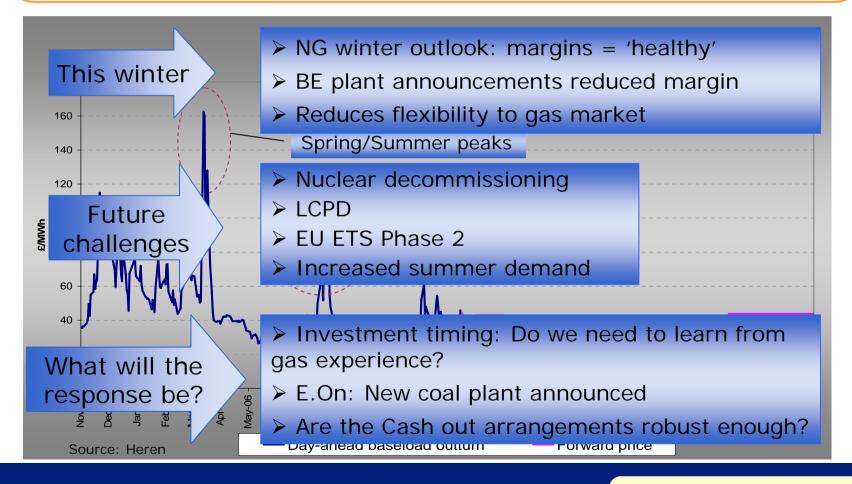
#### Gas supply position has improved...

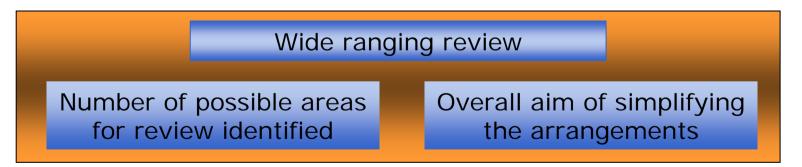
## Fresh look at Electricity Cash Out
