Ofgem consultation majority of respondents in favour of an independent accreditation scheme


2007

Setting the standards ...

Ofgem guidelines to set minimum bar



- Independence;
- Trust;
- Technical and commercial competencies; and
- Communication and advice role.

Based on DEFRA's consultation on establishing a voluntary code of practice for the provision of carbon offsetting to UK consumers. January 2007.

Also may consider a scope of scheme 'bar'....

In theory


With the industry selecting accreditation scheme you could have multiple schemes...
