EDF Energy Network's staff cooperated fully with the assessment team preparing explanatory information in advance, assisting with the provision of evidence as requested and engaging in open and frank discussion. It was apparent throughout the assessment that EDF Energy Networks had undergone, and were still undergoing, significant process changes. In some cases, eg the rollout of Project SAS (relating to information systems), this had made it difficult for the assessment team to gather compliance evidence as the systems were either still in their infancy or still to be implemented. However it was also apparent that a great deal of hard work and effort had been expended to ensure that these systems and processes met the needs of the business, and therefore the assessment team were able to gain assurance from this. It was also apparent throughout the assessment that there is an understanding by staff at all levels what benefits the output from Project SAS will deliver to the business. Additionally, the key areas of policy and the NAMP process addressing; strategy, risk, objectives and targets were noted as being strong, the lamaged and embedded. However, the success of these areas is dependant on sound information from the asset information systems without which it is difficult to continue to make informed asset management decisions. On the basis of the system design as reviewed and the sample evidence of its application, the EDF Energy Network's Asset management System was found to conform to the requirements of PAS 55 part 1 and therefore critification is subject to satisfactory evidence being available that the rollout of Project SAS and the relevant new processes have addressed the concerns raised in the report with regard to inconsistencies between Asset Information Systems and record management. A full surveillance visit will take place no later than 6 months from the date of the certificate. This surveillance visit will focus on gaining
