
First Principles

Well designed competitive energy markets and independent regulation can address the European energy paradigm






Building integrated EU energy markets

Getting it right in practice is key to success


Issue? If got right? If got wrong?

Targeted EU framework	✓ EU rules to complement national regimes and fill the "regulatory gap"	* Confusion in decision- making
Political interference at national or EU level	✓ Stable climate for cross-border investment	* Uncertainty leading to less investment / increased costs to consumers
Unbundling	✓ Proper incentives on EU TSOs✓EU networks act more like National Grid	Risk or perception of ongoing discrimination*Cartelisation of TSOs
