REVIEW OF THE GRID CODE: DECISION AND NOTICE IN RELATION TO CONSULTATION G/08 (Grid Code Requirements for the GB Transmission System Study Network Data File)

The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (the "Authority")¹ has carefully considered the changes that NGET² has proposed to its Grid Code as set out in the report to the Authority arising from consultation G/08 (Grid Code Requirements for the GB Transmission System Study Network Data File)³ that has been submitted to it for approval.

The Authority has decided to approve the proposed changes to the Licensee's Grid Code (the "Grid Code") as set out in Appendix A of the report to the Authority arising out of Consultation G/08.

This document explains the background to the proposals and sets out the Authority's reasons for its decision to approve these changes to the Grid Code. This letter constitutes notice by the Authority under Section 49A of the Electricity Act 1989 in relation to this decision.

Background to the proposed changes to NGET's Grid Code

NGET has proposed changes to the Grid Code to clarify the requirements for the production by NGET of a GB Transmission System Study Network Data File (referred to as a 'Network Data File' for the purposes of this letter) and the timescales during which NGET may provide such a Network Data File to network operators. A Network Data File sets out NGET's view of operating conditions on the GB transmission system. The data in

a Network Data File allows a Network Operator to study the way their network operates with the transmission system, to ensure a co-ordinated approach. NGET is proposing changes to Grid Code Operating Code 2 ("OC2") to:

- Define the scope of information exchanged in a Network Data File, and
- Permit the exchange of such information for a week-ahead timescale.

NGET notes that the Grid Code does not currently explicitly define the scope of a Network Data File or the timescales during which the information may be provided. NGET considers that the proposed G/08 changes to the Grid Code will provide additional clarity for users and will improve the transparency of Grid Code arrangements.

NGET received three responses to Consultation G/08 from authorised electricity operators. NGET reported that all respondents were supportive of the proposed Grid Code changes.

We note that respondents made the following points:

- One respondent noted it was pleased to participate in Grid Code Review Panel discussions about the G/08 change proposal and that it was generally satisfied with the proposed approach.
- One respondent was content with the G/08 change proposal, provided that there is appropriate regulated separation of network and generation businesses.
- One respondent agreed that the proposed changes will provide additional clarity to users regarding a Network Data File.

NGET noted in its report to the Authority that the G/08 change proposal does not have an impact on other industry documents or any additional environmental impacts.

NGET's recommendation

In its report⁴ to the Authority on Consultation G/08 NGET set out the drafting for proposed changes to the Grid Code. It recommended that the Authority approved the proposed changes.

Ofgem's view

Grid Code changes require Authority approval under standard condition C14(3) of the Transmission Licence. Having carefully considered the NGET's report on the proposed changes, Ofgem considers that, having had regard to the licensee's obligations⁵ set out in condition C14(1)(b) of the Transmission Licence ("the obligations") and Ofgem's wider statutory duties⁶, that the proposed changes to the Grid Code should be approved by the Authority. Ofgem's reasons for reaching this decision are outlined below.

The licensee's transmission licence defines the Grid Code objectives as follows:

⁽i) to permit the development, maintenance and operation of an efficient, co-ordinated and economical system for the transmission of electricity;

⁽ii) to facilitate competition in the generation and supply of electricity (and without limiting the foregoing, to facilitate the GB transmission system being made available to persons authorised to supply or generate electricity on terms which neither prevent nor restrict competition in the supply or generation of electricity); and

⁽iii) subject to sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii), to promote the security and efficiency of the electricity generation, transmission and distribution systems in Great Britain taken as a whole.

We acknowledge that network operators require information about the expected transmission system operation to be able to properly assess possible distribution system conditions during operational timescales. We consider that the exchange of summary information such as a Network Data file promotes the security of the electricity system as a whole, which is consistent with the design of the Grid Code as required by C14(1)(b)(iii).

We note that all respondents to NGET's G/08 consultation were supportive of the proposed Grid Code changes. We consider that appropriate licence obligations are in place to prevent the transfer of information from network licensees to generation businesses within a single company group.

The Authority's decision

Based on the reasons set out above, the Authority has therefore decided to approve the Grid Code changes set out in Appendix A of the report submitted to the Authority arising from Consultation G/08 (Grid Code Requirements for the GB Transmission System Study Network Data File).

The implementation date for these Grid Code changes is 1 April 2009.
