Transmission Losses, Reactive and Black Start (6 responses)

- Support for Indexation of Reactive costs to power price
- Limited support for unbundling of losses
- Limited support for longer term schemes

Energy Related Components (6 responses)

- Limited support for unbundling
- Limited support for multi years scheme
- Mixed views on development of a revised NIA methodology



Electricity Mini Consultation Responses

Constraints (6 responses)

- Limited support for unbundling
- Limited support for longer term schemes
- Limited support for scheme adjustments (indexation)
- TO SO aligned incentives (6 responses)
 - Closed 16 October
 - Reviewing responses



Electricity Mini Consultations - Follow Up

Multi Year Schemes

- Further details on expected benefits and costs required
- Clarity on potential operation of two year scheme required
- Risk of increased occurrence of Income Adjusting Events

Unbundled Schemes

- Transparent methodology for separation of costs of interaction components detailed in Initial Proposals Consultation
- Component targets set to drive overall reduction in costs

Development of adjustments

Adjustment methodology must be transparent and not overly complex



Summary (electricity)

Initial Proposals Consultation due end of October

- Looking at developing a 2 year BSIS scheme
- Initial BSUoS forecast suggests costs are increasing over the next 2 years

Responses vital to determine industry opinion

- Will be considered by Ofgem in development of Final Proposals
- Responses due mid December (prior to Christmas break)
