By means of this letter Eni reply with pleasure to the consultation, dated 1st October 2009, on the Storengy UK Limited's application for an exemption from section 19B of the Gas Act 1986.

We agree with your orientation to grant an exemption from negotiated Third Party Access (TPA) for Phase 1 of Stublach gas storage facility for the reason specified hereinafter.

In our opinion, for Phase 1 of Stublach gas storage facility TPA isn't technically and/or economically necessary for providing efficient access to the gas system.

We also agree with your choice to refer to Article 22 of the Second Gas Directive since the Third Gas Directive will be applied as from March 2011.
