Microgeneration Forum

- Established in 2006 to ensure that the interests of microgeneration were understood and fully taken into account in all Ofgem's work
- Previous Forums have provided opportunities for stakeholders to present ideas and opinions and more recent Forums have provided a platform to discuss Government proposals relating to microgeneration
- In the last 2 years Ofgem has reviewed both the export tariffs for microgeneration and the microgeneration market in general and also worked with EST to ensure greater transparency of export tariffs
- Going Forward it is for consideration whether the Forum continues in its present form or whether a 'small generator's Forum' would be more appropriate given the introduction of FIT - to be discussed in the General Questions section later

Microgeneration Forum: FIT Scheme


- The aim of today's Forum is to provide some clarity to all interested parties about the FIT scheme and to ensure they know 'the who, what and where' of access and operation
- The FIT scheme is part of a package of measures being introduced by Government to realise its vision of a low carbon economy for 2020
- The Energy Act 2008 provides Government with the enabling powers to introduce FIT and the subsequent RFI consultation confirmed this commitment and set out the Government's proposals for FIT
- A new Ofgem team, New Scheme Development which is part of the new Ofgem E-serve will administer the FIT scheme
