Charging Boundary between the EDCM and CDCM

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposals regarding the charging boundary between the EDCM and the CDCM. Please find below Haven Power Limited's comments regarding your published impact assessment.

Our preferred option of those presented in the impact assessment would be Option 1 – No Change as this treats existing EHV customers most fairly and does not potentially penalise these customers for decisions taken in good faith in the past. To be clear, a customer moving from current EHV charging to CDCM charging would not just be exposed to potentially higher overall charges, they would be moving from a generally fixed rate methodology to a highly unit based methodology. This would be particularly acute in areas where the Red unit rate is very high.

Our backstop option would be Option 3 – Optional Raised Boundary; this would give larger customers the ability to mitigate any expose to potentially higher CDCM charges with no impact.

I would also suggest that the highest possible level of engagement is maintained with EHV customers so that they are fully aware of the potential impacts to them and their DUoS charges.
