## Making markets work better for consumers



#### **Retail markets**

- Following our Retail Market Review (RMR) we are developing proposals on:
  - Simplifying tariffs
  - Improving the ability for non domestic and domestic consumers to find the best deals
  - Enhancing liquidity
- We are also working on the implications of other initiatives such as the green deal and the consumer landscape review



#### **Wholesale Markets**

- Government is continuing with **Electricity Market Reform** (EMR)
- Electricity Cash Out needs to be considered taking account of the EMR
- We are also working on the capacity assessment of the electricity market and are working with DECC on the licence condition aimed at putting certain limitations on generator behaviour during periods of transmission constraint
- Draft decision on Gas Significant Code Review to be published soon



#### **Smarter Markets**

- Government policy is to roll out smart metering across GB by 2019
- We are engaging with DECC on the regulatory issues relating to roll out
- We are developing a **strategy** for market development on related issues such as settlement, change of supplier and demand side response



## **European Markets**

- Goal for single energy market by 2014
- Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (ACER) is developing the first framework guidelines
- New legislation is coming on:
  - Energy market transparency
  - Investment in cross border infrastructure projects
  - Energy efficiency
  - Congestion Management Procedure in gas
