Project TransmiT: invitation to stakeholder event – progress update

Ofgem is holding an open event to provide an update on the progress of our work on potential transmission charging options under Project TransmiT. The event will be held on **Thursday, 17 November from 1.30pm to 5pm** at the Holiday Inn, Glasgow Airport, Abbotsinch, Paisley, Glasgow, PA3 2TE.

Project TransmiT is Ofgem's independent and open review of transmission charging and associated connection arrangements. We issued an open letter¹ on 9 September 2011, setting out our decision to extend the timetable for our Significant Code Review (SCR) on electricity transmission charging issues under Project TransmiT. These additional steps within the SCR process are enabling more testing and analysis and more stakeholder input, helping to ensure our conclusions are robust. It is our intention to issue a consultation on the options for change and their impacts in December 2011 with a view to making final recommendations in spring 2012.

We have committed to taking this work forward in an open and transparent way, making available the detail of our modelling work as it progresses.

This letter invites interested stakeholders to an event we are holding on 17 November. Please note that this event is not open to the media. The purpose of the stakeholder event is to provide stakeholders with an update on the progress of the technical working group² and also on the detailed modelling work that our consultants, Redpoint Energy Limited, are undertaking.
