Revised plan

Technical Work

- Complete the work of the Technical Working Group – **9th Sep**
- Issue Draft Technical WG report – **mid Sep**
- Initial model runs and model hand over to Ofgem and WG – **early Oct**
- WG meeting to provide feedback – **10th Oct**
- Redpoint to incorporate feedback and re-run model – **mid-late Oct**
- Sensitivity testing – **mid-late Oct**
- Further WG meeting – **9th Nov**
- Issue Final Technical WG Report – **late Nov**

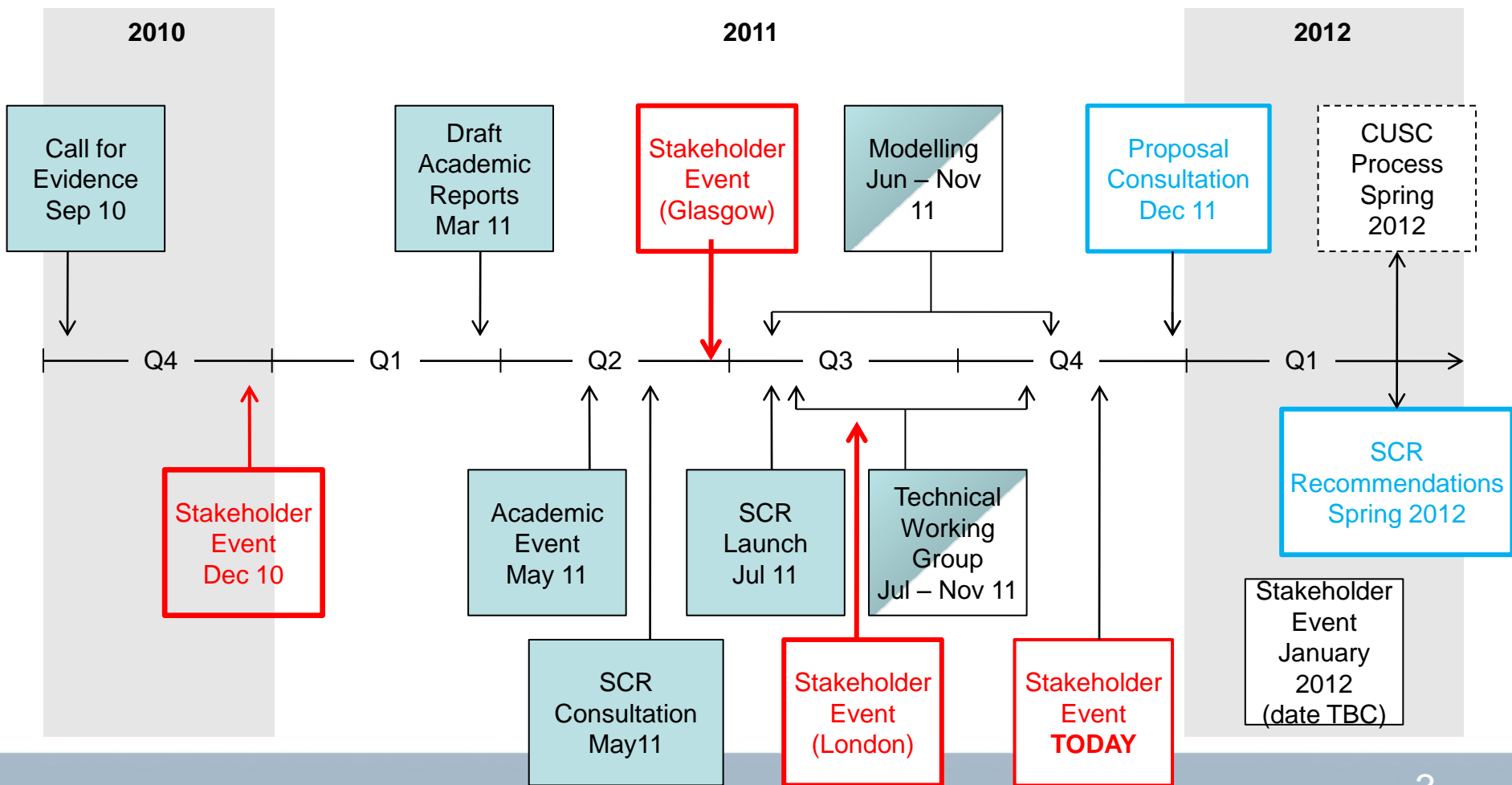
Recommendations

- Stakeholder event to discuss provisional modelling results – **TODAY**
- Ofgem consultation: options for change and their impacts. This will be accompanied by Redpoint's final report – **Dec 2011 with 8 week consultation period**
- Possible stakeholder event – **January 2012**
- Publish recommendations – **spring 2012**
- Where there is a case for reform a direction will be issued to NGET to raise a modification(s) – **spring 2012**

Implementation

- Implementation for any change, if appropriate, will be after **April 2012**.
- We continue to urge industry to implement any appropriate changes as quickly as practicable after we issue our final recommendations.
- Ultimately, industry will decide the manner and timing of implementation

Process to deliver recommendations



Post spring 2012

- The process envisages full industry collaboration.
- The extent of industry involvement through the working groups and stakeholder events could reduce the length of consultation necessary under the industry governance process.
- In recognition that our process may deliver the first TNUoS charging modification under the new governance arrangements and the first SCR, some preparatory discussions have taken place with the Governance Standing Group (GSG) about the administrative practicalities associated with processing a potential SCR recommendation.
- We continue to urge industry to implement any appropriate changes as quickly as practicable after we issue our final recommendations.
- Ultimately, industry will decide the manner and timing of implementation
