Statutory consultation on licence modifications to implement Code Governance Review (Phase 2) final proposals

Today we published our Code Governance Review (Phase 2) final proposals¹ ("CGR2 Final Proposals"). Accompanying this letter we have published the statutory notices² consulting on the licence modifications necessary to give effect to these final proposals.

Background

In September 2012 we published a consultation on Code Governance Review phase 2 ("September consultation") which set out our proposals to extend the outcomes of Ofgem's Code Governance Review³ to other industry codes.⁴ Alongside that consultation we also published illustrative licence drafting of proposed changes to licence conditions that could potentially give effect to these proposals ("licence drafting consultation").⁵

We sought views on the illustrative drafting and invited suggestions on alternative ways of giving effect to the proposals set out in our September consultation. The attached Appendix 1 sets out responses received together with our views on the issues raised.

Relevant Licences

Our CGR2 Final Proposals apply to holders of the relevant licences listed in the table below. The licence modifications would also affect the code parties and other interested parties.

Updated licence drafting

We have updated the licence drafting to reflect our CGR2 Final Proposals. In addition to the amendments set out in Appendix 1, we have also amended the illustrative licence drafting where potential improvements were identified.

Fast track self-governance

In light of feedback received at the November workshop⁶ and within some responses to our September consultation,⁷ we have amended the drafting of the fast track self-governance provision. It was commented that it was unclear whether the criteria for the fast track process set out in the illustrative licence drafting was intended to be an exhaustive list. We have therefore adjusted the wording to be clear that the list is not exhaustive. We have also amended the licence drafting in order that it is not unnecessarily detailed in respect of the process that should be adopted under the codes. The revised drafting retains defined criteria for when this process may be used.

DCUSA self-governance

We have also revised the proposed licence drafting in Distribution Licence SLC 22 in respect of the DCUSA self-governance provisions. In order to aid implementation, recognising that self-governance criteria are already established within this code, the revised drafting largely reflects the existing provisions. Certain amendments are retained in order to reflect our proposal that self-governance should be considered for all proposed modifications, and not be restricted to modifications to only certain DCUSA clauses. We have amended the relevant licence text to refer to the criteria for assessing whether a modification may be made by self-governance, as specified under the DCUSA.

Assessment against objectives

Our final proposals require assessments against the relevant code objectives to be clearly reported for any proposed modification. We have amended the relevant licence drafting to be clear that – where decisions/recommendations are made pursuant to a party vote – parties are not required to provide their own assessments, but rather, to vote according to whether or not they consider the change to better facilitate the objectives of that code. Where a panel provides this recommendation or decision, detailed reasons for their decision/recommendation are to be reported in reference to the applicable objectives.

Self-governance decision appeals

The MRA and SPAA licence conditions⁸ have been amended to provide that parties can appeal against non-implementation as well as implementation of a particular self-governance modification proposal. This is consistent with our initial proposal, however we considered that some clarity in the initial licence drafting was required.

Code administrator 'critical friend'

The proposed legal text inserting a code administrator 'critical friend' concept into the relevant licences has been amended to reflect the fact that consumer representatives are not necessarily classed as 'parties' under the codes. Under the Grid Code and Distribution Code conditions, the wording has also been amended to reflect that code users can suggest modifications, however formal modification proposals can only be made by the licensee.⁹ We have also clarified in the drafting that the duties of the panel and code administrator may be set out documents ancillary to the code.

Implementation

Finally, the 'implementation' clause, which requires the licensee to ensure that the relevant procedures are in place in order to facilitate compliance with the requirements of the condition, has been amended following feedback that this was potentially unclear.

The attached statutory consultations reflect this updated drafting.

Appendix 1 – Responses to illustrative licence drafting consultation

We received 23 responses to our September consultation overall. Three responses were submitted in respect of the illustrative licence drafting consultation, one of which was marked as confidential. The two non-confidential responses have been published on our website, alongside the responses to our initial proposals.¹⁰ It should be noted that we received no specific comments on the illustrative licence drafting for the gas supply licence or the gas transporter standard licence conditions.

Responses to illustrative licence drafting consultation

Responses to the particular questions asked in the licence drafting consultation are summarised below, alongside our comments. A number of minor formatting, stylistic, typographical and cross-referencing type errors and omissions in the illustrative licence drafting were highlighted. We have, where appropriate, updated the licence drafting to rectify such issues and where these were minor grammatical issues or typographical errors they are not discussed separately below.
