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


Background – open letter

- Our July 2012 work programme identified the electricity settlement arrangements as one of four priority areas of reform
- In this document, we committed to publishing an open letter on the way forward on settlement reform in Q1 2013
- Our work on settlement focuses on the Supplier Volume Allocation (SVA) arrangements
- To help inform our decision, we asked the BSC Panel to deliver a report on how it would develop and deliver reform
- We published our open letter (see <u>here</u>) in March 2013

Why do we need to scope out reform?

RISK 1. Drivers of reform are not fully understood


RISK 2. Incentives of industry may not be sufficiently aligned with those of consumers

 Reform does not deliver for consumers
