Yes, we do agree with Ofgem's evaluation of these matters as outlined in the document. Historically, the 'Big 6' have not been keen to make their generation assets available to new entrants. With over 70% of the UK's assets owned by the 'Big 6', this has led to a lack of liquidity which in turn has created barriers to entry, has imposed additional costs on non 'Big 6' suppliers, and has limited the natural growth of competition.
