Question 1 - Do you understand NGET's proposal

We fully understand the proposed changes to the SOW process

Question 2 – What is your view on the usefulness of the proposal and its perceived benefits

The current SoW process is a lengthy and costly one for distributed generation customers. For connecting parties in Scotland, it is recognised when there will be an impact on the transmission system and as a result triggering the need for a SOW. In such instances, the initial stage becomes academic when it is known the outcome will, in all instances, trigger the requirement for a stage 2, project progression. We believe that moving directly to the project progression stage where there is a known impact on the transmission system will improve the overall process greatly and demonstrate more value to the customer.

Question 3 - Do you have any concerns with this proposal

We have no concerns with this proposal. We do however believe further improvements to the SoW could be introduces and will continue to work with NGET during the trial period to identify these.
