

- Launched 27th January 2014
- UK Government's first ever community energy strategy
- Aims to tap into the enthusiasm and commitment of community groups
- Includes a vision for scaling up community energy



Scope and definition of community energy



Community energy in the UK

- At least 5,000 groups active in the UK since 2008
- Greater proportion of people in rural areas involved, particularly in Scotland and South West England
- Currently focused on electricity generation

New key measures announced

- Community Energy Unit
- Industry-led taskforce to achieve greater shared ownership of onshore renewables
- £100,000 community energy saving competition
- Working groups to examine the regulatory issues and recommend ways in which to address the barriers to growth
- Seed funding for a One Stop Shop information resource
- £10 million Urban Community Energy Fund in England



Licence Lite

 The Community Energy Strategy Licence Lite commitment states:

"We will work with communities and Ofgem to look at ways to enable communities to supply electricity, including Licence Lite, with a meeting to be held between community energy groups and Ofgem in 2014."

- Licence Lite Roundtable held in May 2014
- DECC and Ofgem are both committed to Licence Lite as it could increase competition by allowing more suppliers to enter the market



Local Supply

- Working Group established in August 2014
- Members include Ofgem, CEE, CEC, Elexon, Cornwall Energy, Temple Bright and others

Aims:

- Scale of ambition of the CE
- Identify the problems and barriers from realising the ambition
- Establish regulatory baseline and map this against the CE ambition

Next steps:

An update will be provided as part of the strategy 1 year on report in early 2015
