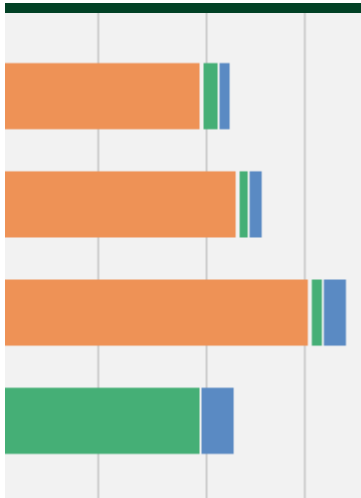

ECO places a legal obligation on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic energy users in Britain.
