


ECO1 final report

On 30 September 2015 we published our final report for ECO1.

All obligated suppliers met their targets for ECO1 delivery.

Suppliers continue to be obligated to deliver energy efficiency measures under ECO2 and we will continue to report on this every month.

DECC's Green Deal and ECO statistics

DECC has published its latest <u>detailed statistics</u> covering installations up to June 2015, alongside its regular <u>monthly statistical</u> <u>release</u>.

These include a breakdown of ECO measures installed over time and by area, while the monthly figures include the most recent data on ECO installations.

Other recent developments

<u>'Pathways to compliance'</u> published

Suppliers are required to conduct independent technical and score monitoring on a sample of ECO measures. This is to ensure the required standards of installation are met and measures are scored accurately.

We have now published our 'Pathways to compliance' guidance note, aimed at suppliers. This explains what we will do when the monitoring requirement is not met or failure rates are unsatisfactory. We have also published an <u>overview of</u> <u>the process</u> for the ECO supply chain.

About ECO

ECO is a government scheme to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from Britain's domestic housing and support people living in fuel poverty by funding energy efficiency improvements.

It places legal obligations on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic premises in Great Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the second phase of ECO (ECO2) runs from 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2017.

Ofgem E-Serve is the administrator of ECO while DECC is responsible for the policy.
