Notice under Part H of Charge Restriction Condition (CRC) 2C (Broad Measure of Customer Service Adjustment) of the proposed text of the Stakeholder Engagement and Consumer Vulnerability Guidance

- 1. Each of the companies to whom this document is addressed is the holder of an electricity distribution licence granted or treated as granted under section 6(1)(c) of the Electricity Act 1989 (the Act).
- Pursuant to Part H of special condition CRC 2C of the Electricity Distribution Licence (the Licence), the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (the Authority)¹ will issue Stakeholder Engagement Incentive Guidance (the Guidance) following consultation on the proposed Guidance.
- 3. On 21 January 2016, the Authority published an informal consultation on its proposed Guidance. It has taken into account the responses to this informal consultation.
- 4. The Authority hereby gives Notice, pursuant to CRC 2C.29 of the Licence, of the text of the Guidance that it proposes to direct. A link to the proposed text is contained in an Annex to this Notice, and the proposed text is published on our website.
