## Direction under Part C of Standard Licence Condition (SLC) 13C (Recovery of Reinforcement Costs arising in respect of Relevant Customers)

- 1. This direction is issued by the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority (the "Authority"<sup>1</sup>) pursuant to paragraph 13C.9 of Standard Licence Condition of the Electricity Distribution Licence (the "Licence").
- 2. Scottish Hydro Electric Power Distribution Plc (SHEPD) is the holder of a Licence granted or treated as granted under section 6(1)(c) of the Electricity Act 1989 ("Act").
- 3. SLC 13C ("the condition") of the Licence prevents the licensee from recovering Reinforcement Costs arising in respect of Relevant Customers<sup>2</sup> through Connection Charges unless Part B of the condition applies.
- 4. SLC13C.2 also requires the Licensee to give effect to the requirements of the condition through their respective Connection Charging Methodology, and where the Licensee is a Distribution Service Provider through the Common Connection Charging Methodology contained in the Distribution Connection and Use of System Agreement (DCUSA).
- 5. Part A and Part B of the condition set out the restrictions on the recovery of Reinforcement Costs arising in respect of Relevant Customers, and the Licensee's ability to recover Reinforcement Costs from Relevant Customers.
- 6. SLC13C.9 of the condition provides that the Authority may issue a direction so that this condition ceases to have effect, once we are satisfied that the Licensee's Connection Charging Methodology has been modified in accordance with SLC13C.8.
- 7. In March 2015 we approved a modification to the Common Connection Charging Methodology contained in Schedule 22 of the Distribution Connection Use of System Agreement ("DCUSA"). The modification incorporates the requirements of Part A and Part B of the condition into the DCUSA version 7.2 (effective from 01 April 2015).
- 8. In accordance with paragraph 13C.9 of the condition, the Authority hereby directs that the condition ceases to exist in the licence of the Licensee to whom this direction is addressed.
- 9. This direction shall have immediate effect.

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The terms "we", "us", "Ofgem" and "the Authority" are used interchangeably in this letter. The Authority is the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority. Ofgem is the Office of the Authority.
