National Grid response to the Code Governance Review (Phase 3) Final Proposals – statutory consultation on licence modifications

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to Ofgem's consultation on licence modifications. This response is provided on behalf of National Grid Electricity Transmission plc (NGET) and National Grid Gas plc (NGG) as National Grid. NGET owns the electricity transmission system in England and Wales and is the National Electricity Transmission System Operator (NETSO). It is responsible for administering the electricity Connection and Use of System Code (CUSEC), the Grid Code and the System Operator – Transmission Owner Code (STC). NGG owns and operates the gas Transmission System and also owns and operates four of the gas Distribution Networks. In association with the three other gas Distribution Network Operators, NGG also jointly provides for the administration of the Uniform Network Code (UNC) Governance arrangements through the Joint Office of Gas Transporters (JO).

Following a review by the National Grid team, we have not identified any additional comments on the proposed Code Governance Review (Phase 3) licence modifications. We would like to note our thanks for the responses provided to our comments in the 'Code Governance Review (Phase 3) Final Proposals - consultation on licence modifications' response dated 28 April 2016.

We also welcome the confirmation that an amended guidance note on the SCR process will be issued.
