

Level 2 – MIS–User Life Cycle

Title: 1.1 Apply

Brief Description

- a) A prospective SEC Party applying for accession to the SEC is also permitted to be a CRS User and therefore is permitted to be a MIS User; or
- b) A prospective MIS User who is not a SEC Party applies to the SEC to be a MIS User

Key Scenarios:

- a) A new Party to the SEC has rights to be a CRS User and their application to accede incorporates this role
- b) A non-SEC Party decides it wishes to have access to the MIS and applies

Actors:

Applicant
SECAS & SECCo
MIS

Preconditions:

- Prospective new MIS User identified by SEC or applicant

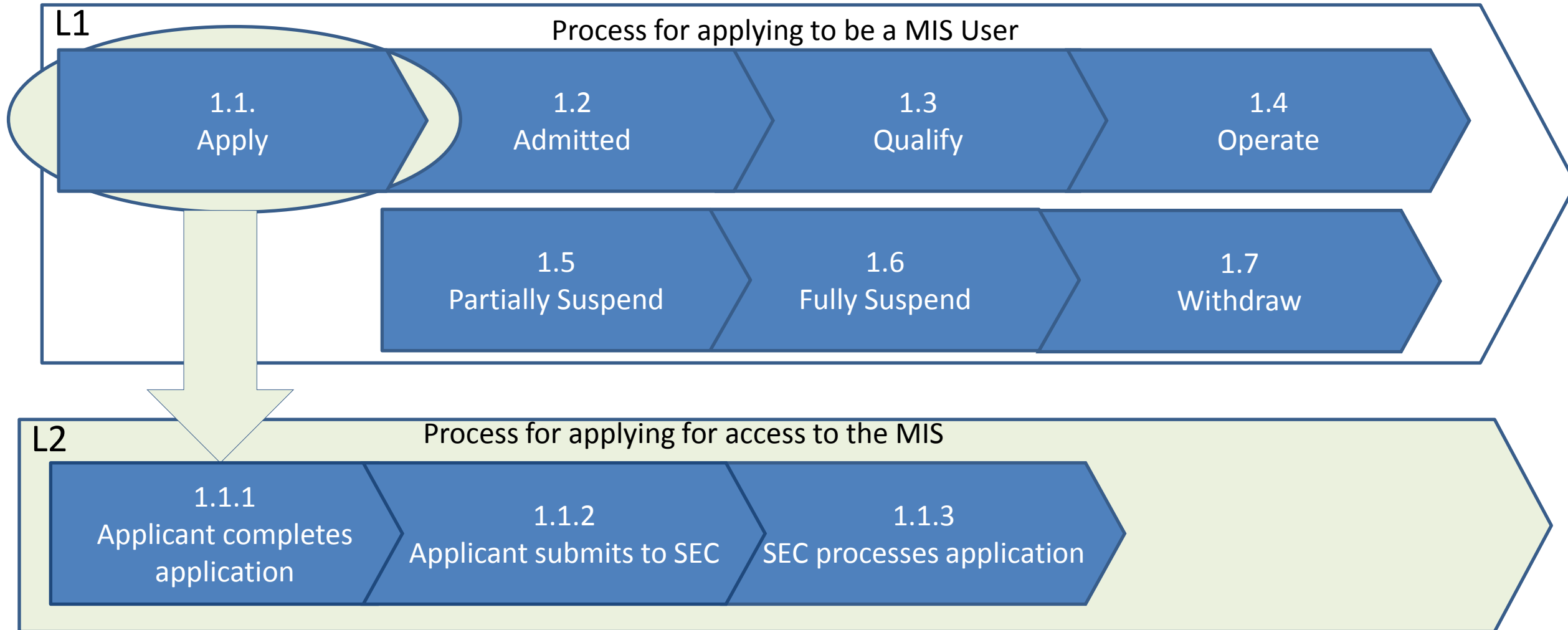
Post Conditions:

- Applicant completes application for access to the MIS (this may be required over and above the SEC Accession Agreement eg admission/usage agreement)

Assumptions

- Not all MIS Users will be SEC Parties
- The MIS will principally be fed by CRS although may obtain feeds from other systems
- Solution Architecture will identify system requirements
- The SEC will be the primary rule book for MIS User controls for CRS content – other industry Codes may drive other MIS content

Level 2 – MIS User Life Cycle

Title: 1.2 Admit

Brief Description: MIS User application is processed

Key Scenarios

The prospective new MIS User's application is processed and they are admitted

Actors

- MIS User applicant
- SECAS & SECCo/SEC Panel
- MIS

Preconditions

- If applicable, SEC Party role permitted to be a MIS User (eg by rights under the SEC)
- Application and admission/usage agreement complete)

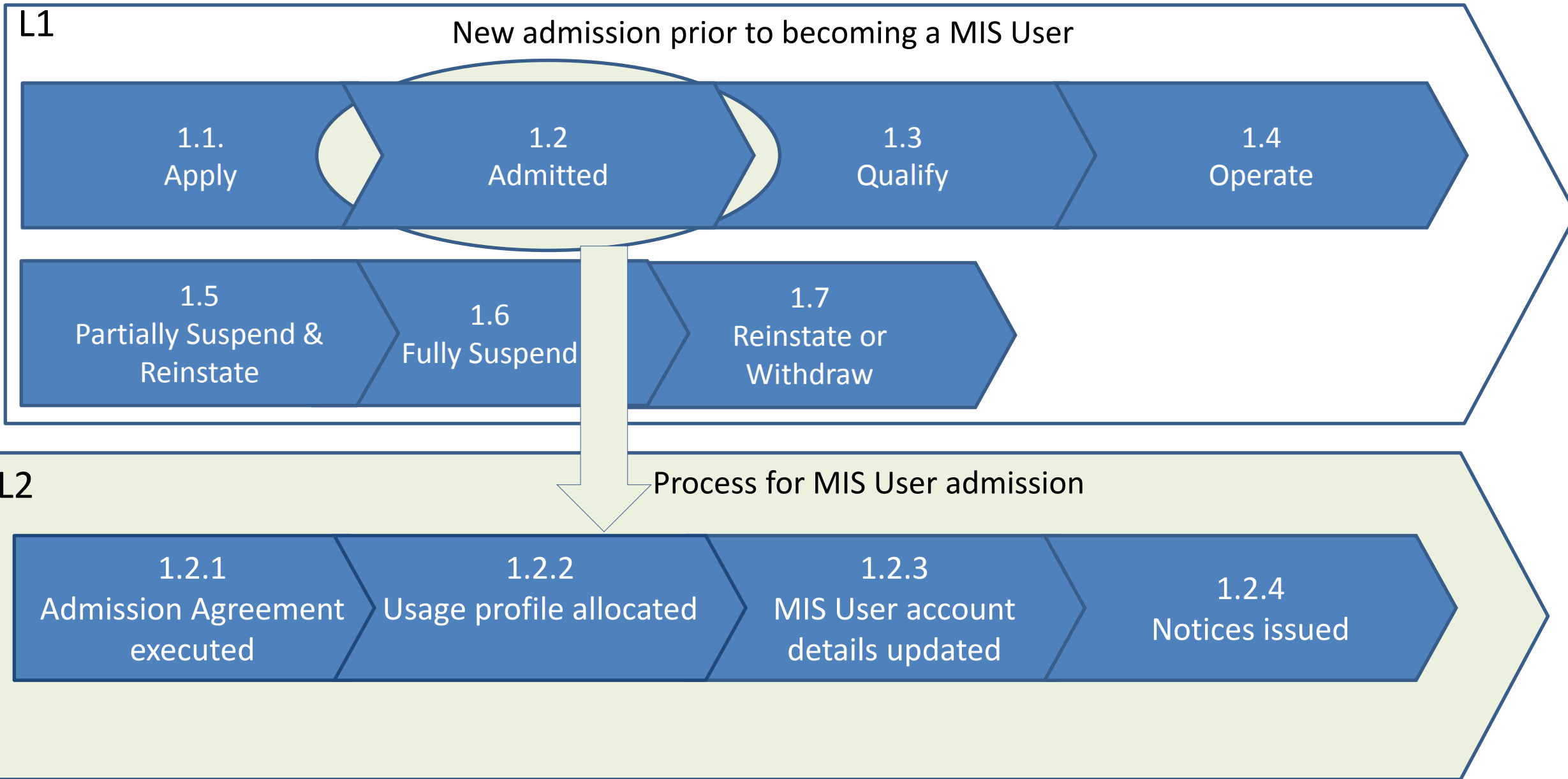
Post Conditions

- Applicant
 - Has signed admission/usage agreement
 - Is admitted as a new MIS User
- **SECAS**
 - Processed application
 - MIS User details updated
- **SECCO/SEC Panel,**
 - Admission agreement executed
- **MIS**
 - informed

Assumptions

- Admission as SEC Party CRS User does not confer rights to be a MIS User without being admitted to MIS
- MIS admission fee TBD
- Further qualification conditions apply, eg
 - CRS User qualification conditions
 - Non-SEC Party bi Lateral admission/usage agreement with SECCo

Level 2 – MIS User Life Cycle

Title: 1.3 Qualify

Brief Description: Prospective MIS User readiness for any qualification conditions prior to being enabled as a MIS User

Key Scenarios

Qualification conditions need to be met to be authorised to proceed as a MIS User

- CRS User conditions (if applicable)
- MIS User conditions

Actors

- MIS User
- SECAS
- Approving Body
- MIS

Preconditions

- MIS Users admitted
- MIS qualification requirements set out in the SEC/SEC SDs

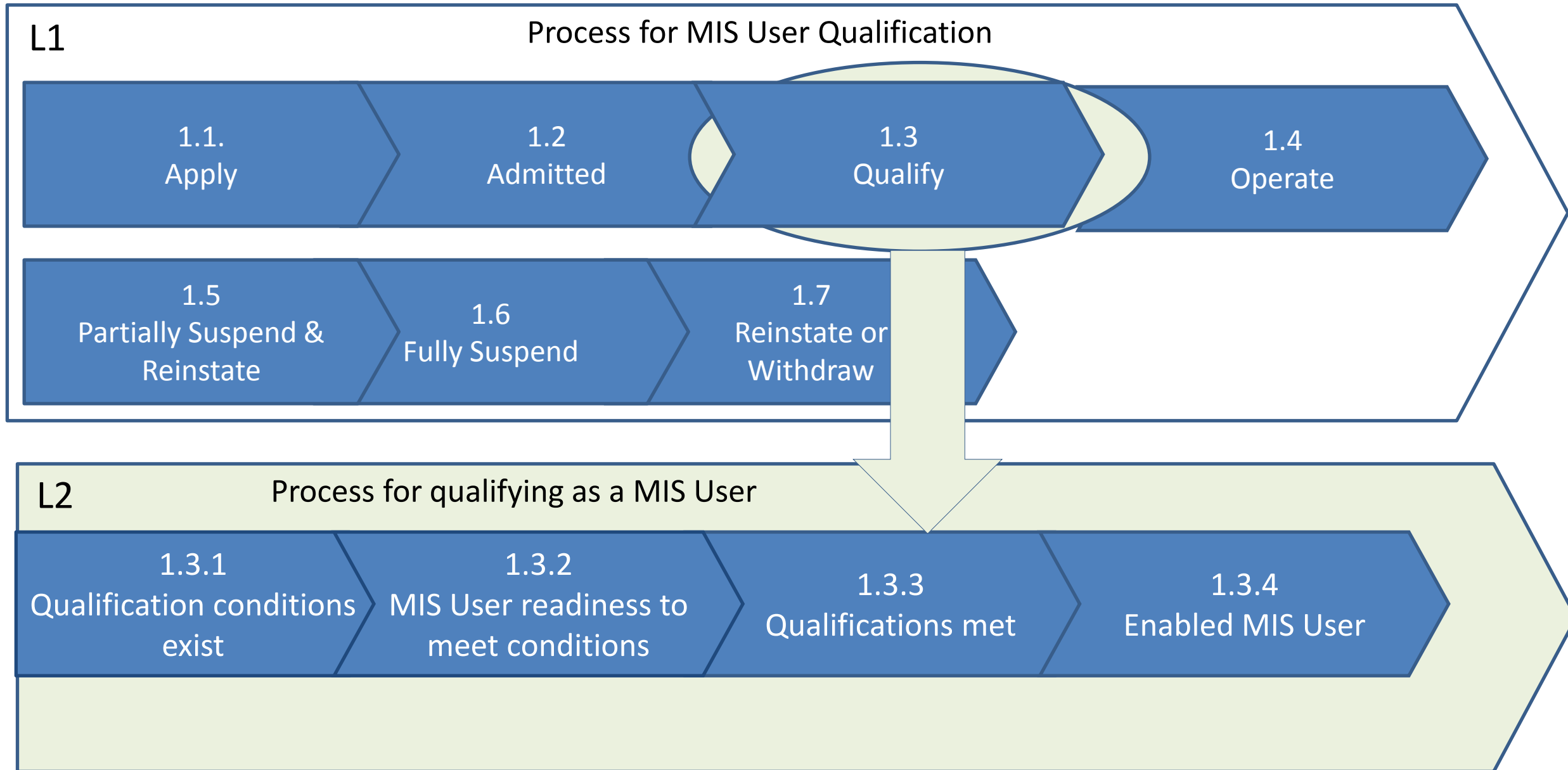
Post Conditions

- Qualification criteria met
- MIS User authorised as a qualified MIS User
- CRS User enabled in CRS

Assumptions

- CRS User entry process test requirements will be set out in the SEC from the perspective of CRS (ie not any other Code requirements)
- Qualification as a MIS User may be factored with other SEC entry/testing criteria' eg may be undertaken/demonstrated in conjunction with DCC/CRS User qualification.
- TBD if MIS User qualification can happen in advance of any other SEC qualification criteria applicable to that User

Title: 1.4 Operate

Brief Description: MIS User operational

Key Scenarios

MIS User has access to their permitted usage

Actors

- MIS User
- MIS

Preconditions

- MIS User is qualified
- MIS recognises the CRS User

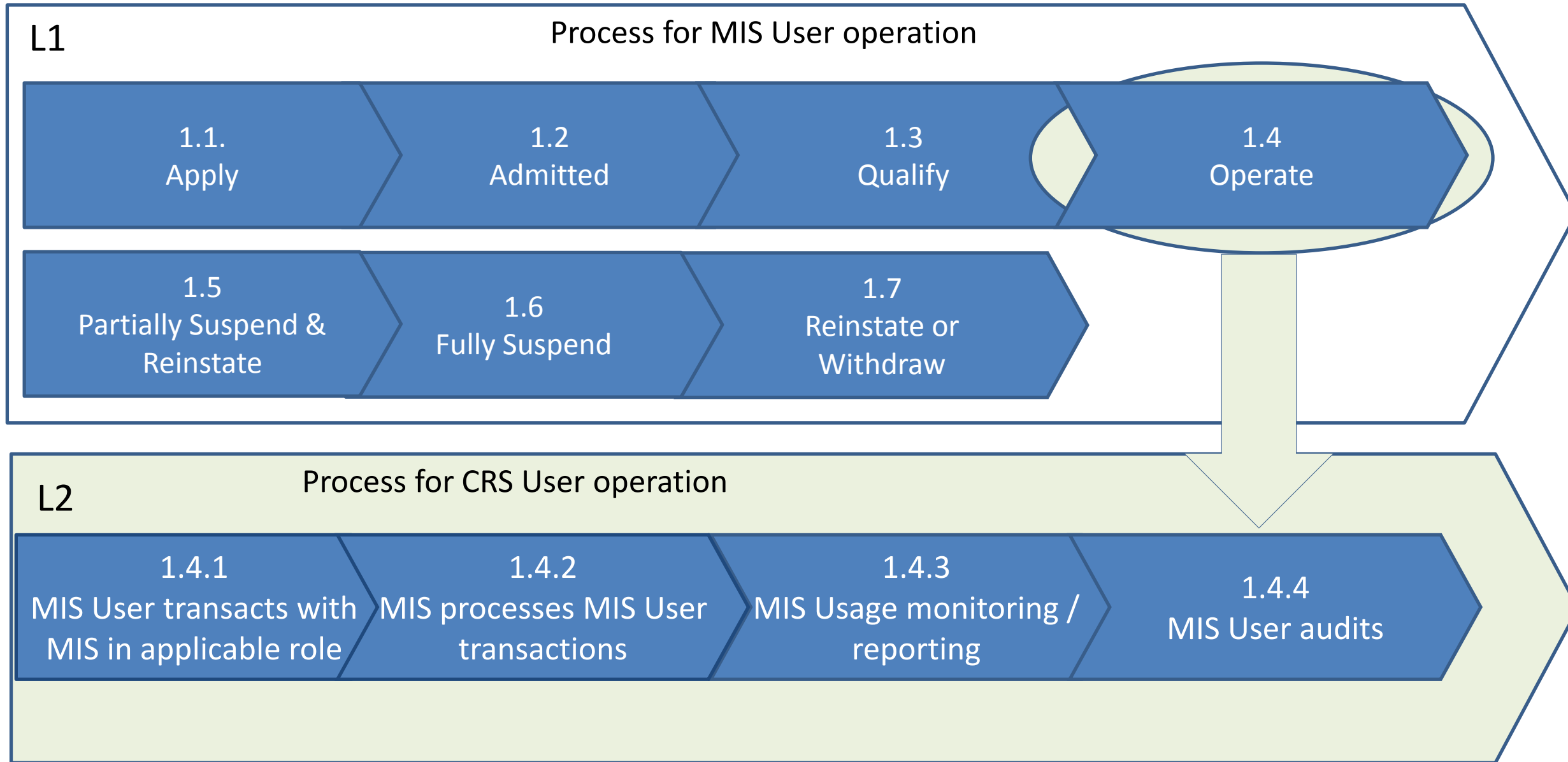
Post Conditions:

- SEC Party permitted to be a MIS User until it ceases to fulfil certain MIS User conditions
- MIS User continues to meet any other post-operation requirements
- MIS capable of generating any required reports from data held within the MIS
- Applicable MIS User monitoring and audit cycle established

Assumptions

- An acceptable use policy will be in place under the SEC
- A MIS User can make changes to their profile, eg account/usage through a controlled process

Level 2 – MIS User Life Cycle

Title: 1.5 Partially Suspend MIS User Rights and Reinstate when Suspension event resolved

Brief Description: A MIS User is disallowed some of its rights as a MIS User due to circumstances which give rise to a partial suspension event and these rights are reinstated when the circumstances are resolved.

Key Scenarios

- [SEC or DCC or Ofgem] has become aware that a MIS User may require partial suspension from MIS
- MIS User resolves suspension event and is reinstated

Actors

- SEC Panel, SECAS, [Ofgem]
- MIS User
- MIS

Preconditions:

- SEC Panel or DCC are aware of a circumstance which could give rise to a consequent partial suspension of access to MIS by a MIS User

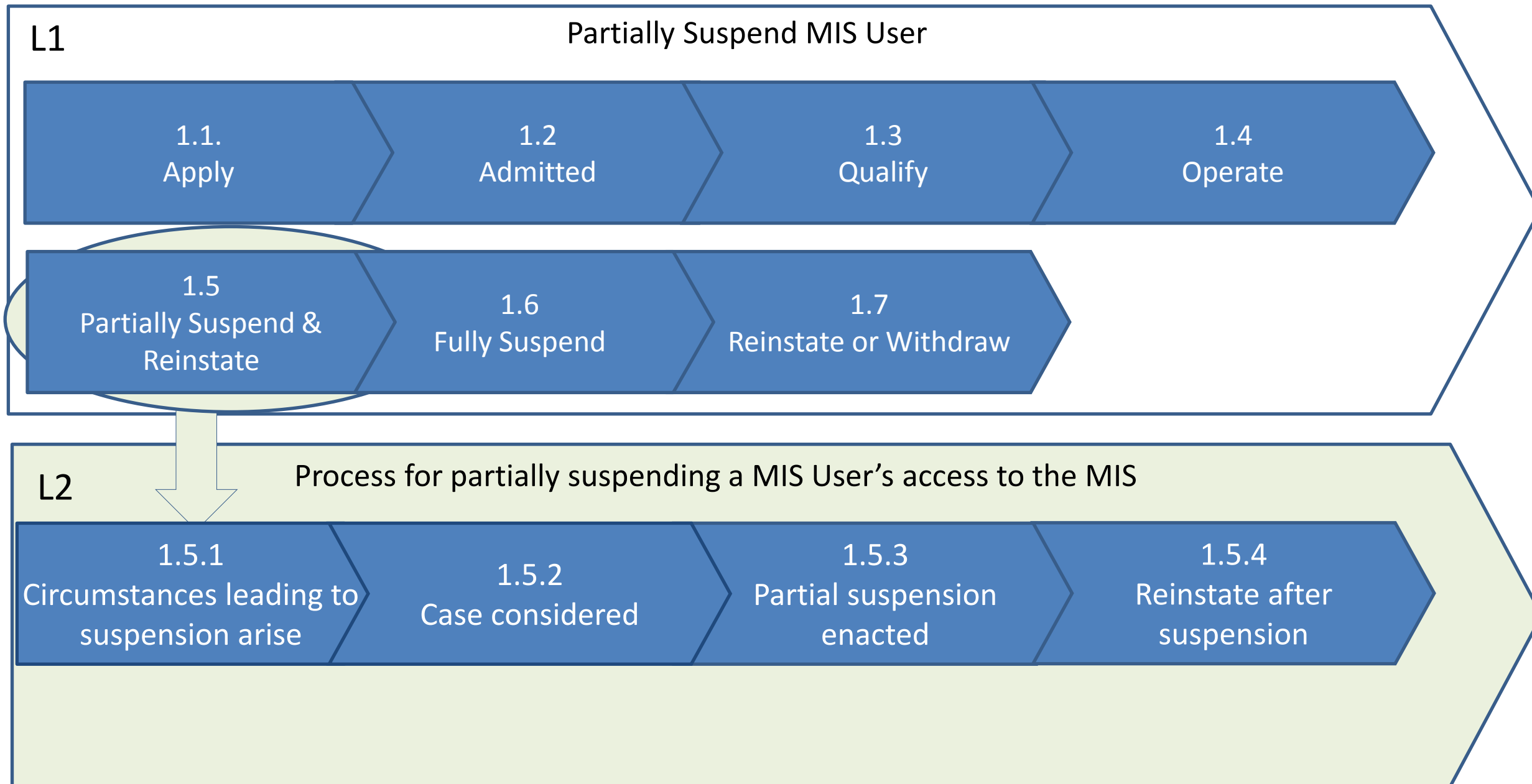
Post Conditions:

- Non-compliance is upheld and MIS User is suspended from access to some of its rights as a MIS User
- Non-compliance is resolved and suspended MIS User is ~~and~~ subsequently reinstated

Assumptions:

- Partial suspension may be related to MIS only or related to an associated CRS partial suspension
- MIS suspension cannot be solely related to a breach of the SEC as it may arise from a default of the admission agreement of the MIS User
- MIS suspension may arise from an issue identified in another Code eg a Network Operator-led suspension event permitted under a different Code - although this is not explicitly represented here on the basis that this is one of the inputs to SEC Panel [or Ofgem] becoming aware of a suspension event at the outset (1.5.1)
- This does not preclude a full suspension arising from a notice from another industry Code – although this is not assumed to be an automatic outcome for a MIS User
- This is a reversible step → Go to Reinstate
- Reinstatement is a 'reverse process' to partial suspension (e.g. permissions are parametrised and configurable as 'Off' and 'On')

Level 2 – MIS User Life Cycle

Title: 1.6 Fully Suspend MIS User

Brief Description:

- A MIS User is disallowed all its rights as a MIS User due to circumstances which give rise to a full suspension event

Key Scenarios

- [SEC or DCC or Ofgem] has become aware that a MIS User may require full suspension from MIS

Actors

- SEC Panel, SECAS, [Ofgem]
- MIS User
- MIS

Preconditions:

- SEC Panel or DCC are aware of a circumstance which could give rise to a consequent full suspension of access to MIS by a MIS User.

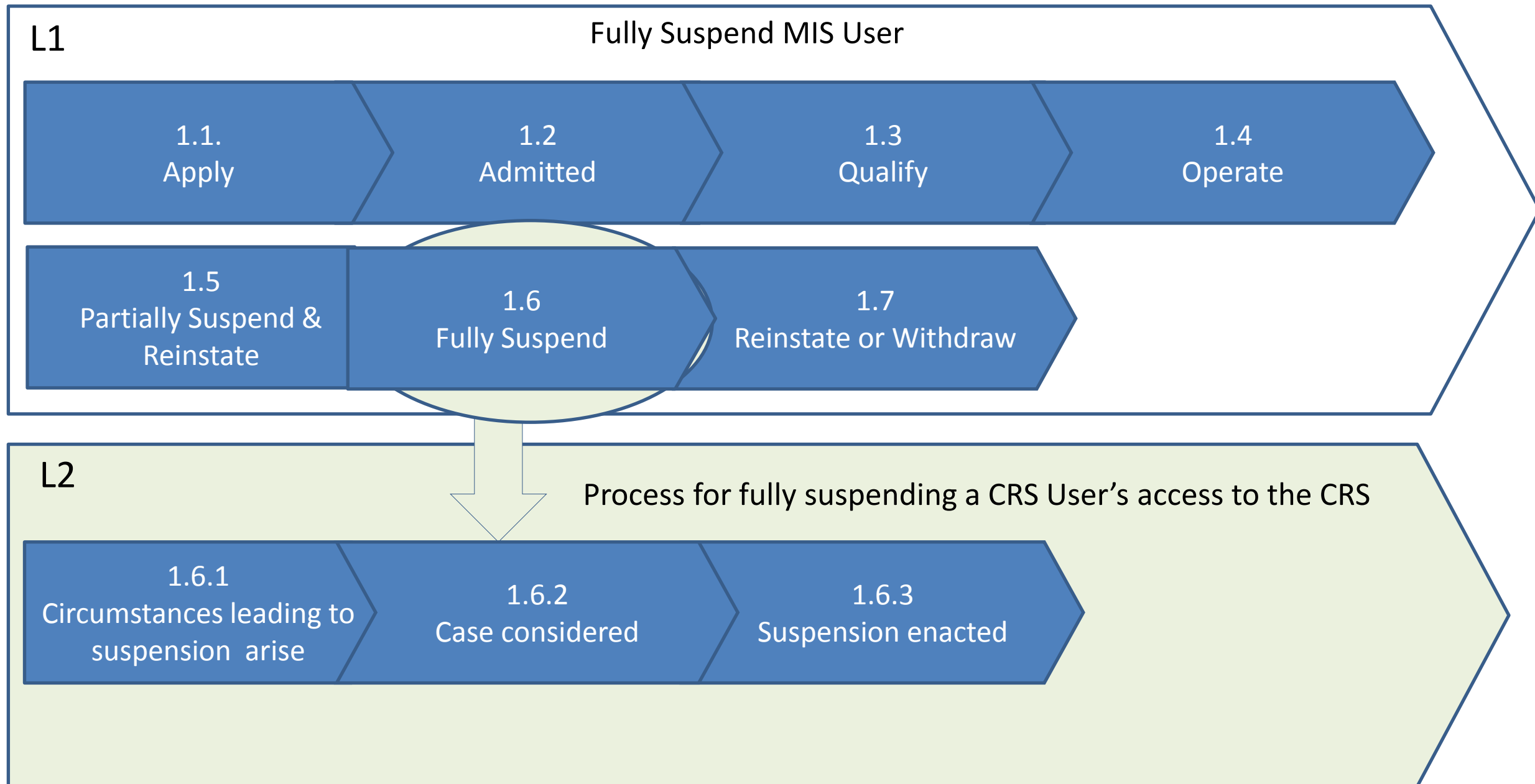
Post Conditions:

- MIS User is suspended from access to all of its rights as a MIS User

Assumptions:

- Full suspension may be related to MIS only or related to an associated CRS partial suspension
- Partial suspension can lead to full suspension, although it is acknowledged this will not always be the outcome
- This does not preclude a full suspension arising from a notice from another industry Code – - although this is not explicitly represented here on the basis that this is one of the inputs to the SEC Panel [or Ofgem] becoming aware of a suspension event at the outset (1.6.1) – and it is not assumed to be an automatic outcome for a MIS User

Level 2 – MIS User Life Cycle

Title: 1.7 Reinstate or Withdraw access to MIS

Brief Description: User access is reinstated or permanently withdrawn under prescribed circumstances

Key Scenarios

A MIS User account is to be either:

Reinstated without constraint as preceding full suspension event has been resolved

OR

Closed down e.g. due to prevailing circumstances that require permanent resolution, eg:

- a long-term partial suspension that has not been resolved
- the User is no longer allowed access due to disqualification
- User has undergone voluntary/involuntary market withdrawal

Actors:

- MIS User
- Approving Body [SEC]
- MIS

Preconditions:

- Reinstatement conditions exist and have been approved [by Panel], OR
- Disqualification conditions exist for a MIS User , either:
 - SECAS/DCC/SEC Panel/Ofgem identify long term suspension or MIS User disqualification
 - MIS User withdraws
 - MIS User ceases to trade (e.g. in administration)

Post Conditions

- CRS User account terminated
- CRS will no longer process any transactions from the disqualified CRS User

Assumptions:

- Reinstatement is a 'reverse process' to partial suspension (eg permissions are parametrised and configurable as 'Off' and 'On')
- Withdrawal is an irreversible step.
- Withdrawal process may be used for SoLR scenarios
