

Our monthly compliance update shows progress towards ECO targets.

The latest set of charts show that 392,252 measures have so far been approved under ECO2, including 29,746 solid wall measures, and 93,983 boiler replacements.




What's the score on ECO measures?

BEIS's ECO monthly statistical release

The Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy has published their latest <u>ECO</u> statistics.

These show that 1,871,464 ECO measures have been installed since the start of the scheme, with 38,927 installed in May.

ECO is a government scheme to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from Britain's domestic housing and support people living in fuel poverty by funding energy efficiency improvements.

It places legal obligations on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic premises in Great Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the second phase of ECO (ECO2) runs from 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2017.

Ofgem E-Serve is the administrator of ECO while BEIS is responsible for the policy.
