<u>Response from an individual consumer - Allocation of voluntary redress payments in the context of enforcement cases consultation</u>

My view is that energy production and consumption (and ultimately the environmental and fiscal cost of both) is one of the big problems our country and the world will face in the near future. As such it is my belief that any money generated from fines to energy companies should go towards helping reduce energy consumption, improve flexibility of the grid to increase micro generation capacity and to boost the industries involved in micro generation technology.

It should fund sustainable renewables generation and improvements to the grid to allow for continuation of diverse energy generation.

The idea that the energy companies can circulate their fines back into their own companies, or subsidiaries is not acceptable and while I understand that setting up an independent charity to regulate this may prove challenging and potentially costly, it probably needs to happen to ensure that the fines genuinely affect the companies being fined and cause them to reform.
