The Carbon Saving Community Obligation (CSCO) was one of the obligations under the ECO2 scheme. The response to BEIS' <u>ECO Help to Heat</u> <u>consultation</u> confirmed that CSCO would end on 31 March 2017.

The Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) has published their latest monthly <u>ECO statistics</u>.

Their statistics show that since the start of the ECO2t, 24,268 cavity wall insulation measures have Lbeen delivered until end of August 2017.

About ECO

The Energy Company Obligation (ECO) is a government scheme that aims to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from domestic energy use and tackle fuel poverty.

ECO places a legal obligation on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic energy users in Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the second phase of ECO runs from 1 April 2015 to 30 September 2018.

Ofgem is the administrator of ECO while the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) is responsible for the policy.
