## Notice of statutory consultation on a proposal to insert new special conditions into the electricity interconnector licence held by National Grid North Sea Link Limited

- 1. The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ('the Authority')<sup>1</sup> proposes to modify the electricity interconnector licence held by National Grid North Sea Link Limited ('NGNSL') and granted or treated as granted under section 6(1)(e) of the Electricity Act 1989 by inserting into that licence 11 proposed new special conditions, as specified in Schedule 1A of this notice.
- 2. We are proposing these modifications in order to give effect to our July 2017 decision<sup>2</sup> on the Final Project Assessment of the NSL interconnector.
- 3. The effect of the proposed modifications is to implement NGNSL's cap and floor regime and reflect the NGNSL's specific elements of the cap and floor regime that are contained in the July 2017 decision.
- 4. Specific details on the reasons for, and effects of, the proposed modifications can be found in Schedule 1B of this notice.
- 5. Further details and background on these proposed licence modifications are set out in the following documents:
  - Decision on the Final Project Assessment of the NSL interconnector to Norway, July 2017; and
  - Our consultation on the Final Project Assessment of the NSL interconnector, published on our website on 18 October 2016.<sup>3</sup>
