Welcome to your latest quarterly update on the Non-Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive (RHI).

It includes information about proposed changes to the scheme, how to stay compliant with emission certificates and what you need to do if your annual declaration is due.

Accreditations update

Between January and March 2018, we accredited 362 full applications and 1 preliminary application. Over the same period we also registered 3 biomethane producers.

This brings the total to 18,184 accredited installations and 85 registered producers of biomethane in Great Britain since the scheme was launched.

<u>Update on changes to the RHI</u>

As we mentioned in our last newsletter the RHI Regulations 2018 are due to come into force this spring. These include tariff guarantees being introduced for certain technologies and changes to eligible heat uses and shared ground loops. Subject to parliamentary approval, these Regulations are expected to come into force in spring 2018.

Staying compliant with emission certificates

We are seeing cases of solid biomass fuels being used on the RHI that aren't compliant with an emissio certificate. Air quality requirements for biomass boilers were introduced in 2013 to ensure boilers don't exceed maximum levels of harmful pollutants.

You must only burn fuels in your installation, which are permitted within the scope of your emissions certificate. If you change or use additional fuels, you must provide us with a new emissions certificate to cover this new fuel. You must also operate your plant in line with the manufacturer's instructions and not use fuel with a moisture content greater than that specified on your certificate. We will take action where we find you are not meeting these requirements. See Guidance Volume 1 Chapter 9 for more details.

Is your annual declaration due?

Every year we'll ask you to confirm a number of statements relating to you and your RHI installation, including that you continue to meet the eligibility criteria for the scheme and are complying with your responsibilities.

To sign an annual declaration, the Authorised Signatory will need to log into the RHI Register and select the Declarations link. You must respond within 28 days, or we may suspend your payments. For further information see Guidance Volume 2 Chapter 2.

Top tips on staying compliant: loose temperature probes

- 1. The probes must be installed in line with manufacturer's guidelines
- 2. The probes must be fully inserted into the pipes
- 3. The probes must be fitted with a tamper proof security tag
- 4. Grease must be used as a bonding agent
- 5. You must provide evidence that you are compliant with the above and we may ask for photos or videos to prove this.

Tariffs updated for RPI and CPI

Tariff rates on the Non-Domestic RHI were adjusted on 1 April in line with the relevant price index. Applications submitted before 1 April 2016 have their tariffs adjusted in line with the Retail Prices Index (RPI) and applications submitted on or after 1 April 2016 have their tariffs adjusted in line with the Consumer Prices Index (CPI).
