Under Section 7 of the Act, Ofgem is required to published a review of whether conditions are in place for effective competition by 31 August 2020 and include a recommendation on whether the cap should remain in place for 2021 or be removed. The Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy will consider this review and make a decision by 31 October 2020.
