Erratum notice - Consent to partially transfer an electricity transmission licence held by National Grid Electricity Transmission Plc to National Grid Electricity System Operator Limited

On 29 March 2018 National Grid Electricity Transmission (NGET) submitted to Ofgem its application to partially transfer its electricity transmission licence to National Grid Electricity System Operator (NGESO). Following this application, on 24 May 2018 Ofgem published notice¹ under section 7A(9) of the Electricity Act 1989 (as amended) of the proposed partial transfer. As no objections were raised within the period of notice, on 4 September 2018 Ofgem consented² to the partial licence transfer from NGET to NGESO. This decision was subject to the condition that relevant standard and special conditions of the electricity transmission licence held by NGET and to be transferred to NGESO were modified.

As part of the partial licence transfer it was the intention of all parties that Special Condition 4I be transferred from NGET to NGESO. This was evident in NGET's application and stated correctly in our notice published on 24 May 2018. However, Annex F of our notice (and subsequently Annex F of our consent) incorrectly showed Special Condition 4I as not in use. As no licence modification had ever been made to remove Special Condition

4I from NGET's licence this was an administrative error. We do not consider this error to have had a material effect on the transfer of Special Condition 4I from NGET to NGESO as the condition was in effect at the time of the transfer and our notice correctly stated that the entirety of NGET's chapter 4 special conditions would be transferred to NGESO, including Special Condition 4I.

We have published this erratum notice to clarify this administrative error and to confirm that Special Condition 4I was transferred from NGET to NGESO. We are making no other changes to the notice. We will publish this erratum notice on our electronic public register.
