[ECO1 technical monitoring report](#)

Following the closure of the first phase of ECO earlier this year, we have now published the final technical monitoring report for ECO1 (2013-15).

The report sets out the high level results for technical and score monitoring under ECO1.

In total 85% of measures monitored were installed and scored correctly. The overall failure rate was 14.9%.

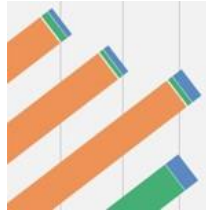

About ECO

ECO is a government scheme to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from Britain's domestic housing and support people living in fuel poverty by funding energy efficiency improvements.

It places legal obligations on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic premises in Great Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the second phase of ECO (ECO2) runs from 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2017.

Ofgem E-Serve is the administrator of ECO while DECC is responsible for the policy.

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
