Notice of statutory consultation on a proposal to modify the standard conditions of all gas supply licences

- 1. The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ('the Authority') proposes to modify the standard conditions of all gas supply licences granted or treated as granted under section 7A(1) of the Gas Act 1986 by amending SLC30 (Supply Point Administration Agreement).
- 2. We are proposing these modifications to ensure that the licence and the governance arrangements of all industry codes have in place a process aimed at delivering changes to the codes in an efficient and timely way.
- 3. The effect of these proposed modifications is to: introduce the ability for Ofgem to raise Significant Code Review (SCR) modification proposals; make amendments to the applicable objectives.
