## Electricity Act 1989 Section 11A(2)

Notice of statutory consultation on a proposal to insert new special conditions into the electricity interconnector licence held by National Grid Interconnectors Limited

- 1. The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ('the Authority')¹ proposes to modify the electricity interconnector licence held by National Grid Interconnectors Limited ('NGIL') with respect to the Interconnexion France Angleterre (IFA) interconnector and granted or treated as granted under section 6(1)(e) of the Act by inserting into that licence the proposed new special conditions as specified in Schedule 3A of this notice.
- 2. We are proposing these modifications in order to put in place a mechanism for NGIL to make payments, where surplus funds cannot be used in accordance with one of the allowed uses specified in Use of Revenues requirements under NGIL's licence, and so it elects to return monies back to consumers by reducing network charges from the GB System Operator.
- 3. Specific details on the reasons and effects of these proposed modifications can be found in Schedule 3B of this notice.
- 4. We consulted on these proposed modifications as part a wider consultation on a number other proposed licence modifications. This informal consultation was published on our website on 4 February 2016<sup>2</sup>.
- 5. Schedule 3C to this notice contains our responses to the issues raised by stakeholders as part of the February 2016 informal consultation on our proposed licence modifications.
