Modification of the standard conditions of the smart meter communication licence: correction

We gave notice on 17 December 2015¹ that we proposed to make modifications to the smart meter communication licence. On 17 May 2016, the Authority made the modifications ("our decision") and set these out, with our decision taking effect at the end of 14 July 2016².

DECC made changes to the smart meter communication licence that came into effect on 13 July 2016³, which included, amongst other things, a change within Licence Condition 22 to introduce a new paragraph 18.

As a result, the paragraph numbering within Licence Condition 22 published in our decision is incorrect. In our decision, we referred to Licence Condition 22 paragraph 18. This should now be renumbered to paragraph 19. All subsequent paragraph numbers should similarly be renumbered.

This letter serves as an addendum to Ofgem's previously published decision and associated notices.
