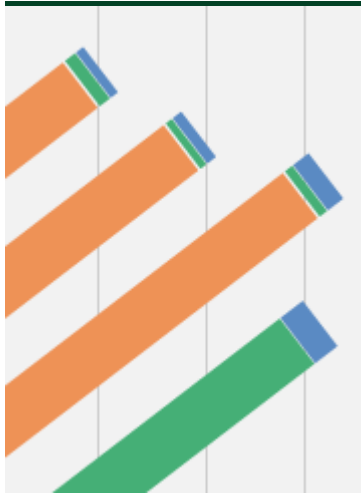

Our monthly [ECO2 progress reports](#) show delivery against suppliers' ECO2 targets. They have been updated to reflect ECO2t obligations.

The latest monthly update shows that 47,728 solid wall insulation installations have been approved under ECO2 from April 2015 to February 2017.

About ECO

ECO is a government scheme to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from Britain's domestic housing and support people living in fuel poverty by funding energy efficiency improvements.

It places legal obligations on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic premises in Great Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the current phase of ECO runs from 1 April 2015 to 30 September 2018.

Ofgem E-Serve is the administrator of ECO while BEIS is responsible for the policy. You can read about Ofgem's role on the scheme on our website.
