

Evidence update for nongas uplift insulation measures

We have updated our requirements for evidencing a premises is non-gas fuelled for HHCRO insulation measures. Delivery of an insulation measure to a non-gas fuelled premises can now be evidenced by the Declaration of Conformity and Completed Installation where the entry for †Pre-main heating source†shows a non-gas heating source. This will be reflected in the ECO2t Guidance: Delivery when it is next updated.

We have updated our <u>installers and</u> <u>industry FAQs</u> to include a question about determining if a heating measure is adequately heating a property.



About ECO

ECO is a government scheme to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from Britain's domestic housing and support people living in fuel poverty by funding energy efficiency improvements.

It places legal obligations on larger energy suppliers to deliver energy efficiency measures to domestic premises in Great Britain. The scheme began in 2013, and the overall obligation period for the second phase of ECO runs from 1 April 2015 to 30 September 2018.

Ofgem E-Serve is the administrator of ECO while BEIS is responsible for the policy. You can read about Ofgem's role on the scheme on our website.
